# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## History and Background

The Delaware Institute of Medical Education and Research (DIMER) was founded in 1969, as an alternative to an in-state medical school, to address the concern of access to high-quality medical education for Delaware residents. Upon creation, DIMER formalized a relationship with Thomas Jefferson University for 20 admission slots for Delawareans at Jefferson Medical College (now Sidney Kimmel Medical College (SKMC)). In 2000, DIMER expanded its education relationships to also include the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM), further increasing access to medical education for Delawareans. Upon creation, PCOM held five admission slots for qualified Delaware applicants and in 2019, the number of admission slots was increased to 10. DIMER is incredibly grateful to both institutions, who continue to exceed their commitments in accepting highly qualified Delawareans into their respective medical education programs and provide the highest quality training to future physicians.

## The DIMER Advantage

Delaware is one of four states that does not offer an in state medical school. However, through its innovative relationships with SKMC and PCOM, Delaware has secured a minimum number of admissions slots for highly qualified Delaware applicants. As a DIMER applicant, Delaware resident applications are pulled from the 10,000 plus applications received by each institution and evaluated against Delaware only applicants. This significantly improves the odds, to being one of ultimately 30 or more slots out of approximately 90-100 Delaware applicants. DIMER therefore provides one of the best medical education admission advantages in the country for qualified applicants from the First State.

## Abstract Data

DIMER welcomed 33 first year medical students for the incoming class of 2023 with DIMER's medical education partners again exceeding their contractual commitments. SKMC welcomed 20 students, while 13 students matriculated to PCOM.

The graduating class of 2023 provided 27 newly graduated physicians looking forward to residency training. For those Delaware medical students who graduated from SKMC and PCOM in 2023, 52% went into a primary care specialty training.

## Delaware Branch Campus and Residency

DIMER is not only focused on providing medical education opportunities for Delawareans but also on the retention of Delaware physicians to serve our communities. DIMER's relationships extend beyond its education partners and into Delaware's health systems and Delaware Health Sciences Alliance (DHSA) partners. DIMER medical students at SKMC and PCOM have an opportunity to conduct their third- and fourth-year rotations at the Delaware Branch Campus. The Delaware Branch Campus provides medical students clinical training at ChristianaCare, Nemours, and the Wilmington VA Medical Center. In addition, PCOM also offers clinical rotation opportunities at Bayhealth's Kent and Sussex Campuses as well as at Beebe Healthcare which is also located in Sussex County.

The opportunities for residency training in Delaware are numerous and expanding. ChristianaCare, Nemours, Saint Francis, and Bayhealth have active and expanding residency opportunities. Beebe Healthcare launched its inaugural medical residency program for Family Medicine during the summer of 2023. Recruitment and retention of Delaware physicians is enhanced with the increased opportunities for Delawareans to complete their medical training and serve their community in their home state.

## DIMER Board Activity for 2023

The DIMER Board remained active and engaged in 2023 with a return to hybrid meetings welcoming board members and members of the public in person and virtually for each of its four meetings. The DIMER Board of Directors welcomed interim chair, Dr. Nancy Fan at its January 2023 meeting. Once again, there was robust Board participation and support for the DHSA-facilitated outreach events for prospective DIMER students in each of Delaware's three counties for those high school and undergraduate students interested in future careers in medicine. DIMER & DHSA leadership were also heavily engaged in virtual and in person engagements for current DIMER students, solidifying its commitment to providing a network of support for DIMER Students in their journey to becoming a practicing physician.

The DIMER Board recognizes the high cost for medical education and enormous debt students face upon graduation and continues to advocate for DIMER graduates relative to the Health Care Professionals Loan Repayment Program (HCPLRP) through the State of Delaware. The

HCPLRP provides loan repayment assistance of up to \$200,000 over four years for recent graduates of residency training who have secured employment to deliver care in Delaware in primary care ambulatory outpatient settings. DIMER leadership looks forward to continued engagement and advocacy as the loan repayment program is utilized to increase opportunities to retain and recruit physicians to Delaware.

DIMER has a rich tradition of extending its activities beyond its mission to ensure access to quality medical education for Delaware residents. DIMER and its partners are committed to providing a network of support for its students and engage students throughout the academic year in a variety of ways. Through its engagement with DHSA, DIMER was featured in numerous presentations throughout the year beyond the county specific events, as well as the focal point for various networking opportunities for DIMER students whether it be through receptions with industry leaders or speaker series and keynote presentations.

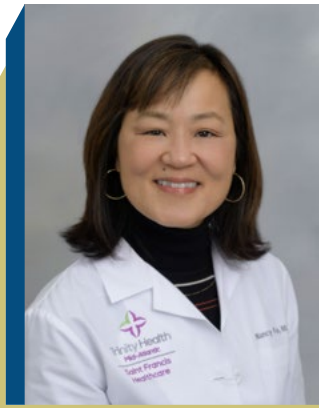
universities with a pre-med program. With the help of DHSA, we are ensuring Delaware high school students interested in future medical professions understand the opportunities that are available to them through DIMER's partnerships in all three counties. By focusing on Delaware's needs and making medical education accessible and affordable, we are bending the cost curve and improving medical care for all Delawareans.

Each year, DIMER provides for 20 admission slots for Delaware residents to attend Sidney Kimmel Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, and ten admission spots for Delawareans at Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM). We are pleased to report that in the last few years, both schools have accepted more students than they committed to accept. We also continue to grow our proportion of under-represented minority students from all

three counties. This year our DIMER class is our most diverse class and is closer than ever to being representative of our great state.

My Department and I are fully committed to the success of DIMER to better meet the medical needs of the people of Delaware. I hope you enjoy reading about the accomplishments of the DIMER program, and on behalf of all of us at the Department of Health and Social Services, I wish the DIMER program continued success in its mission to improve health for all Delawareans.

*When I reflect on 2023 for DIMER from my formative role as interim Chair, it was a year full of significant change, continued progress, and promising innovation.*

Change has come in many forms for DIMER – the passing of Sherman Townsend; the retirement of Dr. David Barlow after many years of service on DIMER for the University of Delaware and the Delaware Department of Education; and the formation of a Legislative Workgroup, which developed recommendations for the revision of the DIMER legislative mandate, last revised in 1997. There has been an exceptional growth of graduate medical education programs in Delaware in the last 10 years, and the DIMER Board recognized this as an opportunity to accurately reflect this growth and change with equitable representation on the DIMER Board. Additionally, as Chair of

the Delaware Health Care Commission (DHCC), I believe these new legislative changes should incorporate the recommendation for an election process for both the Chair and Vice Chair, with term limits. Currently, the Board chair is appointed by the DHCC Chair. By formalizing an election process by the Board in revised legislation, with flexibility by the Board to develop the actual details of the election process, DHCC acknowledges the broad experience of the DIMER Board and supports the Board to achieve its goals and priorities, with broad latitude. These legislative changes will ensure that the DIMER Board may reflect all the stakeholders who have a role in developing a “healthy” health care workforce in Delaware, including an educational pathway for students; professional development with more graduate medical education opportunities; and exposure to recruitment opportunities back to Delaware.

As the annual report will note in more detail, continuing to provide Delawarean student residents with a medical education remains our top priority. We value our partnership with Sidney Kimmel Medical College and the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine and working collaboratively with them. They continue to enroll an exceptional number of outstandingly qualified students who call Delaware their home. I truly appreciate their data updates, regarding the racial and geographic demographics of their accepted students. DHCC recognizes the preponderance of evidence that quality patient care occurs when patients are able to connect with their physicians both racially and culturally. However, there continues to be disparities between the health care workforce in Delaware and our patient population, with under-representation for our black and brown communities, and with the lack of practice locations in areas of highest need. DIMER, as the de facto “medical school” for Delaware should work to address how these disparities can be addressed during the training and recruitment of our future physicians, in collaboration with DHCC, DHSA and our school partners.

Recognizing that the journey to becoming a physician starts long before people decide to go to college, DIMER has continued its fruitful partnership with DHSA outreach initiatives. The virtual events for high school students, and even middle school students, throughout the state

promote awareness of a career in medicine and provide crucial information for the students who may have an interest. Additionally, I applaud DHSA’s innovative initiatives which promote diversity and help guide Delaware college students to successfully become DIMER students. These include their partnership with the Harrington Trust to provide preparation and funding for the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) for under-represented minorities and DHSA’s collaboration with Delaware universities to provide preparation for Delaware students for application to DIMER’s partner schools, Sidney Kimmel Medical College and Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. DIMER is committed to working with DHSA and any public/private partner in providing opportunities which encourage students to pursue a career in healthcare and promote a feasible pathway to a fulfilling and successful career, as that pathway starts long before students are accepted in college, medical school, or a graduate medical education program.

I am proud to have had this opportunity to serve as DIMER’s interim Chair and be part of this transitional period for DIMER and look forward to 2024 with the knowledge that the DIMER Board will continue to promote Delaware students so that they may obtain a medical education, as well as support efforts to recruit and retain our physician workforce to provide optimal, quality-driven access to care.

Thank you for reading this important report and we value your interest and partnership in the coming year.

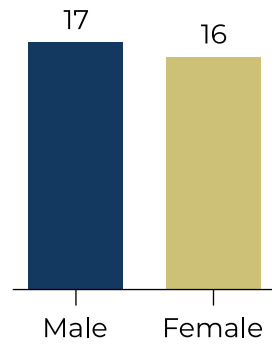

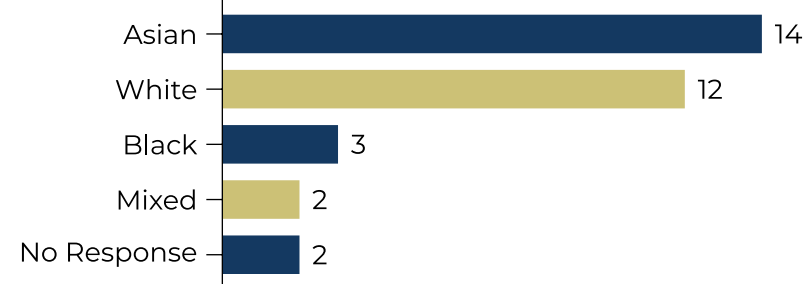

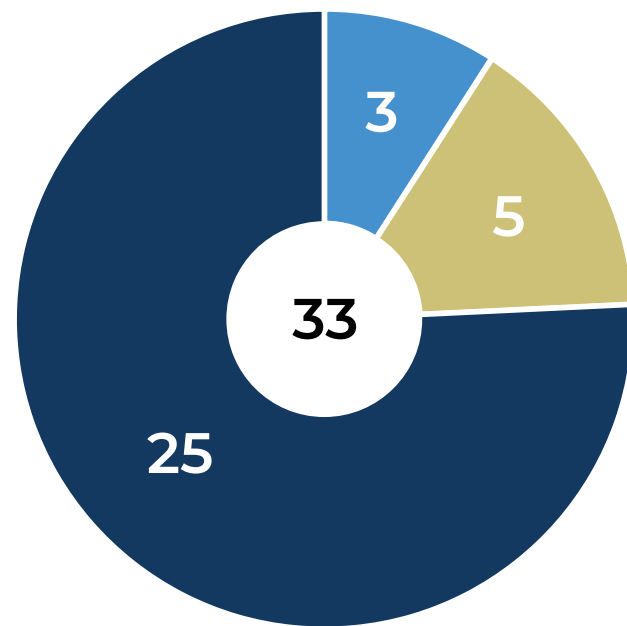

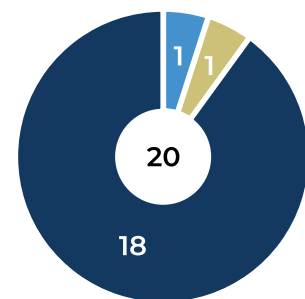

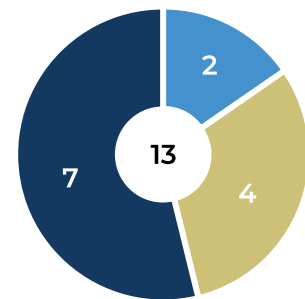

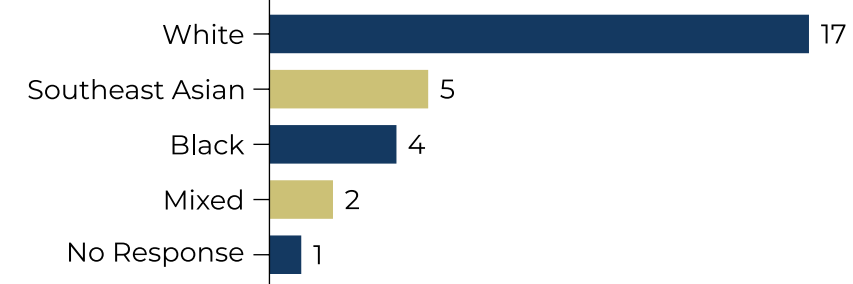

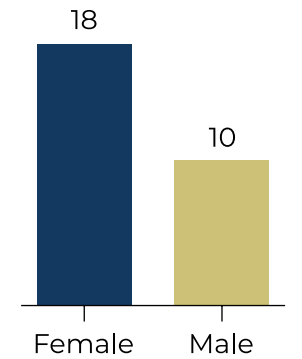

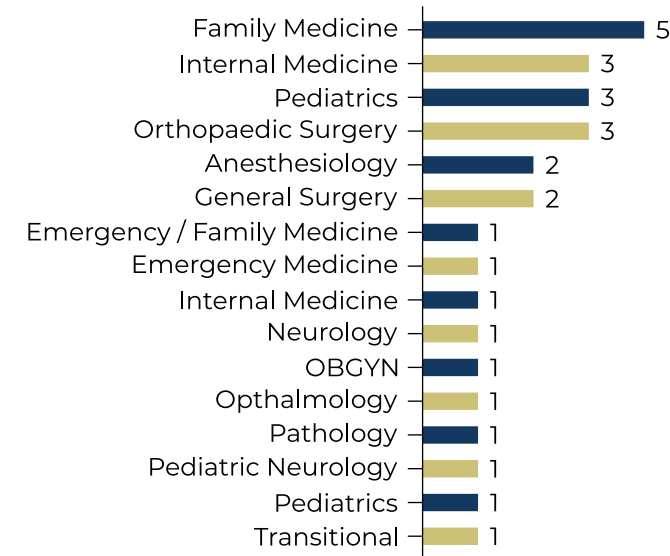

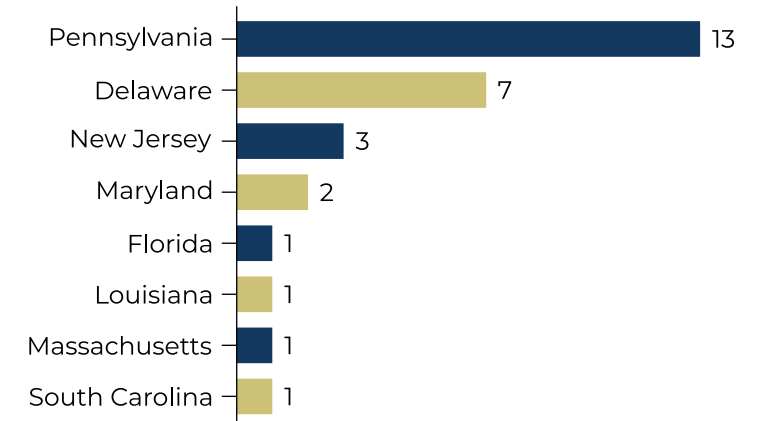

## Sidney Kimmel Medical College

Celebrating its bicentennial, Sidney Kimmel Medical College at Thomas Jefferson University (SKMC) has been educating physicians for 200 years and has awarded more than 32,000 medical degrees. As DIMER's founding medical education partner, SKMC is pleased the relationship and collaboration continues more than 50 years later. Delaware continues to provide highly qualified and competitive applicants and SKMC looks forward to educating Delaware physicians for many years to come.

In 2023, seven SKMC students matched to first year postgraduate positions in Delaware, one in family medicine, one in emergency medicine, and one in internal medicine-pediatrics at Christiana Care; one in internal medicine at Bayhealth Medical Center; and three students matched at Nemours Children's Hospital in pediatrics.

For the incoming Class of 2023, SKMC had 10,922 applications, including 65 from DIMER applicants, approximately 0.6% of the total pool. SKMC Admissions made over 430 offers of admissions, 25 of them to Delaware residents. That means that approximately 38% of the DIMER applicants received an acceptance compared to an acceptance rate of 4% for the general application pool.

By way of comparison, for the incoming Class of 2022, SKMC had 11,089 applications, including 91 from DIMER applicants, approximately 0.8% of the total pool. We made 438 offers of admissions last year, 32 of them to Delaware residents. That means that approximately 35% of the DIMER applicants received an acceptance compared to an acceptance rate of 3.6% for the general application pool.

Dr. Ibrahim is the Anthony F. and Gertrude M. DePalma Dean at Thomas Jefferson University's Sidney Kimmel Medical College. He is also the President of Jefferson University Physicians.

Prior to joining Jefferson, Dr. Ibrahim served as the Senior Vice President for the Medicine Service Line at Northwell Health, Chair of the Department of Medicine, and was the David J. Greene Professor of Medicine for the Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra/Northwell. Dr. Ibrahim has also held prior tenured faculty and leadership positions at Weill Cornell Medicine, the University of Pennsylvania and the Philadelphia VA Medical Center.

Dr. Ibrahim is a National Institutes of Health (NIH) funded physician-scientist. Health equity has been a focus of his research and scholarship. His research on racial/ethnic variation in the use of knee/hip replacement in the management of

end-stage osteoarthritis has been continuously federally funded for over 20 years. Dr. Ibrahim was a past recipient of a prestigious NIH K24 award – supporting his role as mentor for future generation investigators focused on patient-centered research in healthcare disparities.

Dr. Ibrahim was recently inducted to the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) as a member for his contributions to health, medicine and research. Dr. Ibrahim has served as Associate Editor of the American Journal of Public Health and as a member of the Journal for General Internal Medicine's editorial board. He is currently Associate Editor for The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) Health Forum. He also served as a NIH Council member for the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities and for the National Institute for Arthritis, Musculoskeletal and Skin Disorders.

Dr. McGee, an emergency physician, is the Vice Dean for Graduate Medical Education at the Sidney Kimmel Medical College and Vice Provost for Clinical Education in the Thomas Jefferson University. He also serves as Enterprise Lead for GME for Jefferson Health overseeing 5 Sponsoring Institutions, more than 180 programs, and nearly 2,100 residents and fellows. # Making Connections in Delaware While Serving Its Community

Medical students and residents have always demonstrated a deep commitment to serving their communities. In January 2023, Sidney Kimmel Medical College students joined forces with pediatric residents at SKMC/ Nemours Children’s Hospital for the first annual Martin Luther King Jr DIMER Day of Service. Pitching in to help at the Ronald McDonald House in Wilmington as well as providing MLK Jr coloring pages in Nemours lobby, students and residents recognized the importance of service through their actions. # Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine

The Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine has served as the official osteopathic medical school for the State of Delaware since 2001 through its partnership with the Delaware Institute of Medical Education and Research (DIMER). PCOM emphasizes the training of physicians for primary care or family practice, with over 60% of our graduates engaged in family practice or a primary care specialty. In these 23 years, more than 250 PCOM medical school graduates have moved through the DIMER program.

Once again, PCOM has exceeded its DIMER contractual agreement enrollment goal of 10 DIMER candidates. We also increased diversity and secured candidates from all Delaware counties. For the 2022-2023 application cycle, we received 67 applications from DIMER candidates, interviewed 41 candidates, accepted 33, and matriculated 13 students to the Philadelphia Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine program. Delaware residents who submitted a completed application to the Philadelphia campus osteopathic medical program had a much higher rate of invitation for interview. Delaware residents had a 61% acceptance rate and a 39% yield from the acceptance rate.



While the largest population of our PCOM Dimer candidates come from the University of Delaware, we also enrolled candidates from Boston College, Michigan State University, and Xavier University of Louisiana this year. We continue our work with the University of Delaware Med Scholars. We are creating a pathway of early involvement with middle school students (Early College) and the MAPPs chapter at Delaware State University.

PCOM's recruitment initiative for our DIMER students is a reality and strengthens with each admissions cycle. In July, we hosted our first-ever DIMER affinity group for our incoming M-1s filled with DIMER trivia and current PCOM M-2s, M-3s, and M-4s acting as co-hosts. We opened the school year in September, hosting the PCOM DIMER dinner in Delaware (for the first time) at the Hilton Wilmington/Christina. Most recently, we hosted our M-1s at a grab-and-go luncheon just after their first encounter in the cadaver lab! 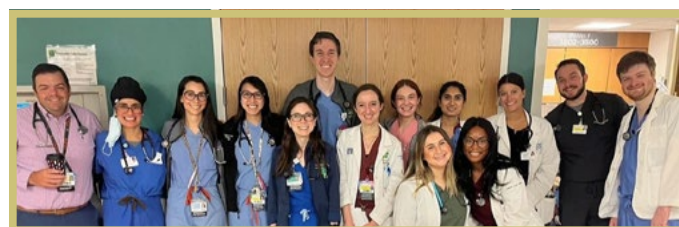






Our partnerships with Sidney Kimmel Medical College (SKMC) and Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) continue to grow as we attract top talent from both institutions. In the summer of 2023, we were fortunate to welcome 23 third-year Branch Campus students: 12 from Sidney Kimmel Medical College and 11 from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine.

During the match of 2023 we were proud to welcome graduates from our partner medical schools into our residency programs. Sixteen SKMC and PCOM graduates joined our residencies, 7 from SKMC and 10 from PCOM. DIMER students continue to return home to Delaware to serve their community. This year 5 DIMER students matched into ChristianaCare residencies, 1 from Sidney Kimmel Medical College (Branch Campus) and 4 from Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (2 Branch Campus). In addition, we added four Branch Campus alumni to our residency programs this match season, Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, and Medicine/Pediatrics.

Every June we graduate approximately 100 residents from our residency programs. This year two of our graduating residents were DIMER students during medical school. We are proud to say that both physicians have elected to stay at ChristianaCare for employment.

ChristianaCare has implemented a successful Branch Campus curriculum which enhances the students' on-campus educational experience. In-person and virtual sessions are held on a regular basis and offer the students' guidance and mentorship to prepare for the residency application process. In addition, students have the opportunity to train in a simulation setting, specifically orthopedic assessment and technique, suturing, airway management, vaccine administration and IV insertion.

In partnership with the Center for Worklife Wellbeing, Dr. Mark Mason and his team have expanded elective personal growth consultations to all Branch Campus students to enhance wellbeing, self-efficacy and help seeking. Additionally, wellbeing rounds are now offered 3-4 times per year with topical discussions and stress-relieving activities. As the 2023-2024 academic year concludes, we are looking forward to welcoming 24 third year Branch Campus students onto campus in summer 2024 to begin their 3rd year clerkship rotations. Enrollment consists of 12 Sidney Kimmel Medical College students and 12 Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medical College students.

This year was Dr. Brian Alverson's second year as Residency Program Director and Vice Chair of Education at Nemours Children's Hospital. Dr. Alverson was previously from Brown University, where he served as the Director of the Division of Pediatric Hospital Medicine and Director of Undergraduate Education at the Warren Alpert School of Medicine at Brown University.

The Nemours Children's Hospital, DE is a multispecialty, tertiary care, 200-bed free-standing children's hospital located in Wilmington, Delaware. As the only children's hospital in Delaware, our hospital offers the entire spectrum of pediatric medical and surgical subspecialties. We are fortunate to have been recognized by a variety of national organizations as a site for outstanding teaching and clinical care.

We have pooled the considerable resources of three major institutions to create exciting, high-quality programs in patient care, biomedical research, and medical education. We enjoy the strong financial backing of Nemours, the broad patient base of the Nemours Children's Hospital, DE and Christiana Care, and the rich academic heritage of Sidney Kimmel Medical College (SKMC) of Thomas Jefferson University. These partnerships have enabled us to develop a unique education program. DIMER students who train with us are able to gain a wealth of experience working with nationally recognized physician-educators in a variety of pediatric disciplines and with patients in the hospital, clinic, and private practice settings. Students rotate through the medical/surgical units, general pediatrics clinics, newborn nurseries, and private practitioners' offices. They gain experience with the various aspects of well-child care and normal growth and development, as well as common and uncommon pediatric diseases. We also offer advocacy training for students and residents to learn to become a voice for children's health in the clinical setting and the community.

The DIMER program continues to be an excellent resource for Nemours Children's Hospital, DE, providing numerous local trainees who are passionate about serving the people of Delaware. We are very happy to have DIMER students from SKMC rotate with us during their clinical (third)

year. We welcome senior medical students (4th year) from SKMC and the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) in a variety of clinical and research experiences. Through rotations as 3rd and 4th year medical students, we are able to introduce the students to our renowned children's hospital and expose them to the broad scope of Pediatrics.

Many DIMER students continue their training as residents in Pediatrics at Nemours Children's Hospital, DE. DIMER students who enter specialties such as Family Medicine and Emergency Medicine at local residency programs, such as Jefferson or ChristianaCare, also gain valuable pediatric training at Nemours. Some DIMER graduates of our Pediatric Residency Program have become our Chief Residents and many have pursued fellowships and attending/faculty positions here and at other prominent institutions. The leadership of our Pediatric Residency Program consists of a program director and five associate program directors, and two of the associate program directors are graduates of the DIMER program! Through DIMER, we have been able to recruit physicians who go on to serve their home communities in a myriad of ways, including teaching and advocacy.

This year we focused on the creation of two new tracks for the residency, and overhauled the didactic curriculum for the residents to dovetail with requirements of the American Board of Pediatrics exam. The two new tracks are the HELA track, which stands for Health Equity, Leadership and Advocacy. Residents on the HELA track enjoy primary care training at the flagship Nemours Jessop Street Clinic in Wilmington. They get extra training in health equity, leadership, community involvement and receive a special certificate for expertise in Primary Care and Health Equity. The other new track is the global health track. Residents in this track receive extra training in global health and do two rotations abroad, as well as a variety of scholarly activities and experiences here in Delaware at our Refugee clinic.

SKMC/Nemours Children's Hospital, DE had an outstanding match in March 2023. Of those matched in the categorical program, all 24 were

from US medical schools, one was from Canada, representing 18 different medical schools and 10 different states and British Columbia. Of the newly matched residents, 12% are underrepresented minorities. We matched two new residents into our combined program of Pediatrics / Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, and one into our Child Neurology residency.

Our pediatric residents continue to participate in important research projects. Of those who graduated in 2023, 11/21 pediatric residents presented research abstracts at regional or national scientific meetings. In addition, 5/21 published case reports, book chapters and scientific publications.

We celebrated Pediatric Resident and Fellowship Graduation in June 2023. Graduates from our Pediatric Residency Program found excellent careers after training. This past year, 12 accepted fellowship positions in exceptional programs across the country, 2 accepted a position as a Hospitalist or in Urgent Care, 1 joined our academic faculty, 6 joined office practices and 3 became our current Chief Residents.

We are currently conducting interviews for our Pediatric Residency Program for the Match in 2024, and all of these are done virtually via Zoom. (This is the procedure for all pediatric residency programs across the country since 2021). Although we regret not having students tour our hospital and meet directly with our staff, there have been no technical issues with our virtual interviews.

Medical education remains a priority at Nemours Children's Hospital, DE. DIMER students continue to receive an excellent experience in pediatrics, with dynamic in-person interactive learning experiences and family-centered rounds. We are excited to have moved back to this style of education for our DIMER students.

We look forward to partnering with DIMER for many more years.

As the first teaching hospital in central and southern Delaware, Bayhealth is a springboard to bring more doctors into the community. In July of 2023, Bayhealth welcomed its third class of Internal Medicine and Family Medicine residents, second year of General Surgery residents, and the first class of Emergency Medicine residents, bringing our total number of residents to 70. Bayhealth also received accreditation for a Hematology/Medical Oncology Fellowship program that will begin July 1, 2024; at full complement, this three-year program will have 6 fellows. We are excited to have our first DIMER resident within the Family Medicine Residency Program at Bayhealth!

The PCOM Simulation Center at Bayhealth, led by Sarah Beebe, PhD, APRN, CHSE, earned Provisional Accreditation from the Society for Simulation in Healthcare in July 2023. The center provided over 18,000 individual learner contact hours to residents, undergraduates, and clinicians throughout the organization in 2023, with a major focus on fundamental skills and simulating emergency and deteriorating patient scenarios. Undergraduate Medical Education continues to thrive. In 2023, Shalini Shah, MD (Family Medicine) was joined by Zohaib Ghatala, MD (Internal Medicine) in Undergraduate Medical Education leadership. As a core clinical campus, we continue to provide core rotations for third-year students from Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine and elective rotations in the 4th year. We have affiliations with both Drexel and Sidney Kimmel Medical College. In the 2022-2023 academic year, Bayhealth hosted 289 clinical rotations, including 44 audition rotations for residency. In the 2023-2024 academic year we have 2 DIMER students with 2 more expected in the 2024-2025 academic year.

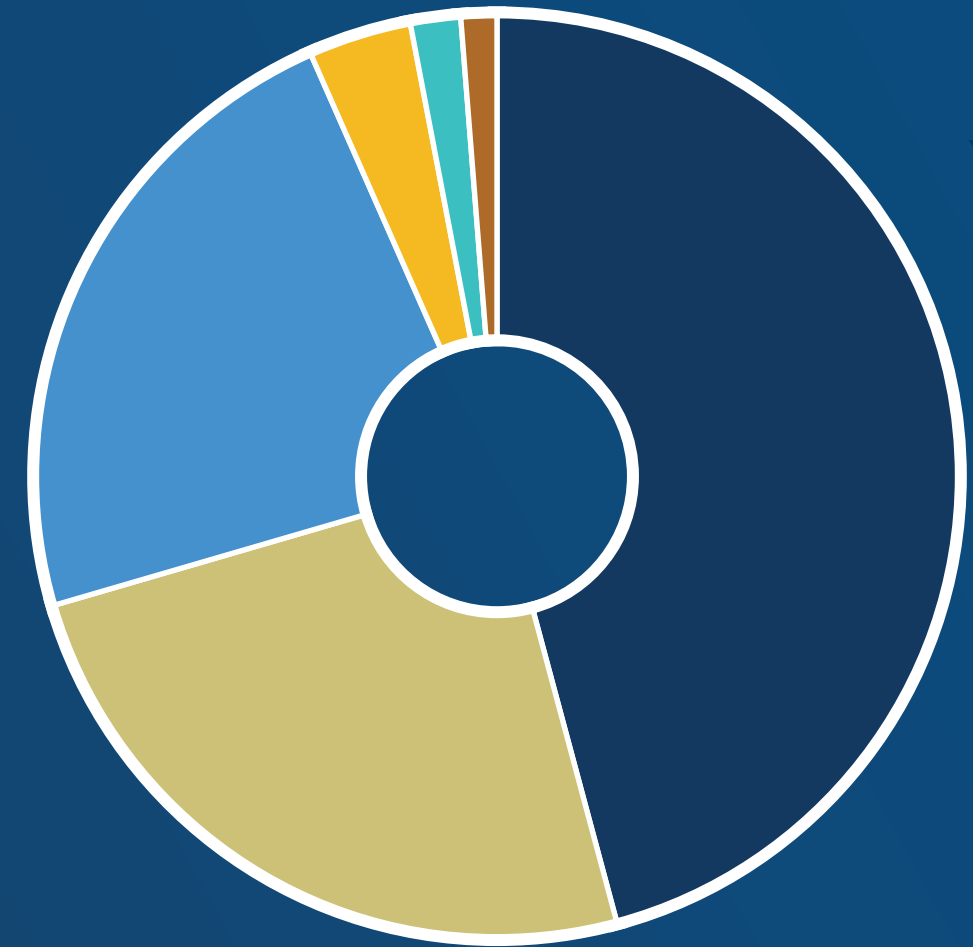

# DHSA Updates

The Delaware Health Sciences Alliance (DHSA) recognizes the importance of pipeline development and creating access points for increasing Delaware's medical workforce. By engaging at various entry points of the pipeline, from high school students to attending physicians, DHSA is uniquely poised to influence traction in the future of our workforce. Through its innovative strategies and partnerships, DHSA continues to lead efforts supporting this pillar of focus and priority.

Through fostering relationships with its members and partners, DHSA expanded its reach for highlighting DIMER in 2023 beyond the DHSA led county specific DIMER events. In 2023, DHSA presented at several conferences and other unique opportunities including but not limited to the Delaware HOSA Annual State Conference. This conference is an annual event and competition for Delaware HOSA student members statewide who have committed interests in health sciences and future careers in medicine. Additionally, DHSA had the opportunity to not only present but also curate a panel of experts for the University of Delaware's Health Sciences Summer Camp. The UD Health Sciences Summer Camp provides high school students from across the state the opportunity to gain exposure not only the University but numerous partners through hands on learning and presentations. Students reside on campus for the week and the camp is prioritized for students who may be first generation college as well as those underrepresented in medicine.

In 2022, DHSA held its first annual Pre-Med Advisors Collaborative Retreat. For the first time, Pre-Med Advisors, Educations and School Leaders from the University of Delaware, Delaware State University and Delaware Technical Community College came together for an afternoon discussing the role of pre-med advising and shared opportunities for success and lessons learned. In 2023, DHSA brought the group together again for an engaging afternoon of shared learning and opportunities for identifying further collaboration strategies to support the success of Delaware's pre-med students. The group was joined by guest presenter, Dr. Robert Motley. Dr. Motley is Vice Chair for Community Medicine and Director for

the Physician Shortage Area Program at Thomas Jefferson University and Sidney Kimmel Medical College and provided valuable insights into SKMC's rural health medical education tract and opportunities for Delaware students, especially those residing in Kent and Sussex Counties.

In 2019, DHSA launched Delaware Day. Delaware Day is a physician recruitment initiative bringing together all of Delaware's health systems in a collaborative recruitment effort. DHSA works closely with recruiting partners to identify anticipated openings and targets its event to DIMER alumni, focusing on residents finishing training in Delaware and the mid-Atlantic region to recruit key Delaware talent for the Delaware community.

Due to the success of previous years' events and in an effort to maximize opportunity, DHSA Delaware Day was again held virtually over Winter 2023. The event included a live moderated panel discussion with partner recruiters. Delaware Day recruiting partners not only discussed opportunities available but also touched on an array of topics from characteristics making their institution and patient populations unique to how their institutions offer job design and the work they are doing to support work life balance and well being.

DHSA is pleased to share the 2023 Delaware Day event once again provided 100% of our recruiting partners with resumes of interest. DHSA looks forward to providing this annual event to support recruitment and retention of Delaware's qualified and talented physicians and would like to thank our 2023 Delaware Day partner institutions and participants.

DHSA is grateful to its members and partners for continued collaboration and partnership in our collective work enhancing pipeline entrance, addressing pipeline barriers and creating opportunities for those seeking to provide care in Delaware.

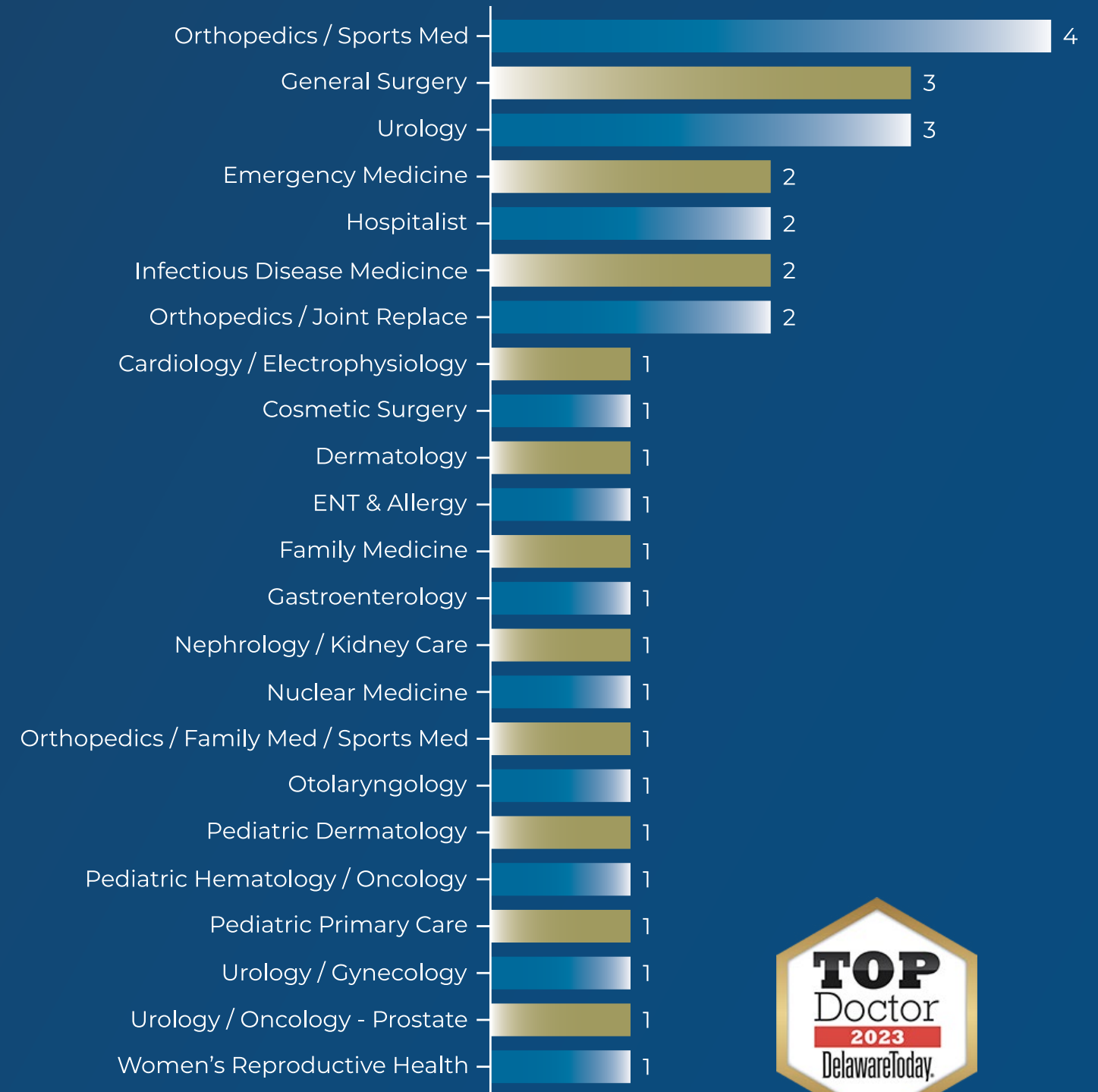

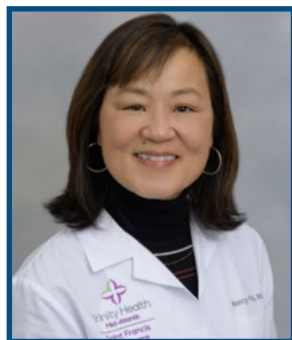




# Welcome New Board Members

# DHCC Update

## Health Workforce Development Department of Health and Social Services Office of the Secretary, Delaware Health Care Commission

The Delaware Health Care Commission (“DHCC”) strives to foster initiatives, design plans, and implement programs that promote equitable access to high-quality affordable care, improve outcomes for all Delawareans, and foster collaboration among the public and private sectors regarding health care. A sustainable health care workforce is essential to an effective health care delivery system. Recognizing Delaware’s health workforce challenges, the DHCC continues to address these challenges through various initiatives and programs such as loan repayment programs and a Health Workforce Subcommittee.

### DHCC Health Workforce Subcommittee

The DHCC created the Health Workforce Subcommittee (“Subcommittee”) in December 2020 to assess and address Delaware’s health care workforce challenges. The Subcommittee is a public/private body that meets quarterly and was initially co- chaired by Nicholas Moriello, Segment President of Highmark Blue Cross Blue Shield, and by DHCC Commissioner and Department of Finance Cabinet Secretary Rick Geisenberger and later joined by Kathleen Matt, University of Delaware.

In the Subcommittee’s first year, stakeholders from across Delaware were invited to share their challenges in developing and sustaining the workforce across the full range of healthcare professionals. There was also special attention directed towards evaluating the workforce in areas of high demand such as: geriatrics, Alzheimer’s, child psychiatry, substance abuse, and mental health. These discussions led to an understanding that more accurate health workforce data were needed. Work was clearly needed to analyze the healthcare workforce and their practice location in relation to need and demand as reflected by incidence of disease.

Further discussions with community partners emphasized the need for identifying shortages in primary care and other specialties, and developing predictive models for workforce development. All of this would depend on Delaware developing highly accurate health workforce data bases to evaluate workforce needs. As a result, in November 2021, the DHCC contracted with the Delaware Academy of Medicine / Delaware Public Health Association to develop a database, Delaware Health Force (“DHF”), to document the distribution of health professionals in Delaware. DHF launched in the fall of 2022 and is currently being used to monitor the number of health professionals throughout the State, bring awareness to significant areas of need, and predict potential shortage areas that may arise in the next few years. These data are being used by the Subcommittee to better inform policy decisions and resource allocations based on the needs of the community. The DHF dashboards are based on data from the Delaware Division of Professional Regulation (DPR) and other data sources including the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Upcoming events will include a Health Workforce Summit to discuss strategies that Delaware might implement to build and grow a strong resilient health workforce.

## Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Program (HCPLRP)

Delaware is facing a shortage of primary care providers. These shortfalls make it more difficult for Delawareans to access health care services throughout the state. In August 2021, Governor John Carney signed House Bill 48 with House Amendment 1 establishing the Health Care Provider Loan Repayment Program (“HCPLRP”). The state-funded program offers medical school debt relief for primary care providers who agree to practice in underserved areas of the state for two years.

The DHCC is responsible for the administration of the program and may award education loan repayment grants to new primary care providers up to \$50,000 per year for a maximum of four years. Priority consideration may be given to DIMER-participating students and participants in Delaware based residency programs. Applications are accepted on a rolling-basis and reviewed in two cohorts each calendar year (March 15 and September 15). The program

was officially launched May 2022 after final program parameters and scoring guidelines were established by the HCPLRP Advisory Committee and DHCC.

On August 31, 2023, Governor Carney signed Senate Bill 98. The legislation extended the time in which providers may apply for a Health Care Provider Loan Repayment grant from six months to two years following completion of their graduate education. In addition, the legislation added additional eligible degrees: Doctor of Dental Surgery, Doctor of Medicine in Dentistry, Licensed Psychologists, Licensed Professional Counselors of Mental Health, Master of Psychology, and Licensed Clinical Social Workers.

The DHCC received 14 applications during calendar year 2023; two were found eligible for awards, two were found ineligible, one incomplete application, one declined a contract, and eight applications are pending review.

## State Loan Repayment Program (SLRP)

The DHCC continues to administer a State Loan Repayment Program (“SLRP”), an initiative supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (“HRSA”) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. SLRP strives to create healthier communities by recruiting and retaining quality health care professionals to practice in rural and urban settings designated as Health Professional Shortage Areas.

The program offers financial assistance up to \$100,000 for verifiable educational loans to qualified dental, behavioral/mental health, and primary care professionals for a minimum of two consecutive years of full-time (40 hours per week) or half-time (20-39 hours per week) service in shortage areas across the State. In September 2023, Delaware received a 3-year grant in the amount of \$675,000 (\$225,000 annually).
