National ADRC Initiative Overview

Overarching Goal of ADRCs

Empower individuals to make informed decisions about their long-term service & support options & to streamline access to existing services & support.

AOA & CMS Joint Initiative

National ADRC Initiative *Vision*

To have Aging & Disability Resource Centers serving every community as highly visible & trusted places where people of all incomes & ages can get information on the full range of long term support options & a single point of entry for access to public long term support programs & benefits.

National ADRC Initiative Purpose

- Awareness: provide information about the array of long-term support services & options
- Assistance: empower people to make informed choices, based on personal preferences
- Access: facilitate access to long-term support services & options

National ADRC Initiative Critical Elements

- Seamless system from consumers perspective
- High level of public visibility & trust
- Coordinates or integrates aging & disability service systems
- Formal partnerships across aging, disability & Medicaid agencies
- Serves individuals of all income levels

National ADRC Initiative Core Functions

- 1. Information & Awareness
- 2. Options Counseling
- 3. Streamlined Access to Public Programs
- 4. Person-Centered Hospital Discharge Planning
- 5. Quality Assurance & Evaluation

ADRC Core Function #1 Information & Awareness

- An ADRC serves as a highly visible & trusted place where people of all ages, incomes & disabilities can receive information & assistance on a full range of long-term support options.
- An ADRC is defined by its ability to promote options among underserved, hard-to-reach & private paying populations.

ADRC Core Function #2: Options Counseling

- An ADRC provides Options Counseling to anyone seeking assistance with long term support services – both public & private.
- Options Counseling is an interactive decision-support process providing consumers & their families &/or caregivers, with "one-on-one" counseling as needed.
- Options Counseling empowers consumers to identify & understand their needs; assist in making informed decisions about long-term support choices based on person-centered needs, preferences, values & individual circumstances.

ADRC Core Function #3: Streamlined Access to Public Programs

- An ADRC serves as the one-stop access point for all publicly-funded long-term care supports, including those funded by Medicaid, Older Americans Act or other state revenue programs.
- An ADRC streamlines access to the full range of public service options in the State.
- Requires protocols/procedures to facilitate integrated access (i.e. client intake, needs assessment, care planning, eligibility & service delivery).

ADRC Core Function #4: Person-Centered Hospital Discharge Planning

- An ADRC creates formal linkages to facilitate access to long-term care supports in "critical pathways", including hospital discharge planning.
- Linkages ensure people have information needed to make informed decisions about support options through critical transition points in the health & long-term support system.
- Promotes person-centered, home & community-based services.

ADRC Core Function #5: Quality Assurance and Evaluation

- An ADRC has a system in place to ensure the quality of all services & to evaluate outcomes & costs.
- Establishes performance goals & indicators related to:
 - ADRC Systems: Visibility, Trust, Ease of Access, Responsiveness to Needs
 - ADRC Programs: Efficiency & Effectiveness
 (i.e. ability to implement methods that enable money to follow the person)

ADRCs – It's the Network

 ADRCs are not about replacing existing organizations & networks.

 They're about building a better, more coordinated network.

ADRC...More a Process than an Entity

- Moving from experts working in isolation to partnerships, co-location, coordination, routine communication, cross-training
- Moving from focus on eligibility & offering a set menu of services to a proactive consumeroriented approach, intensive outreach to individuals of all ages & income levels, comprehensive options counseling.



National ADRC Initiative Background & DE Timeline

2003-2008

- ADRC's are established in most states & US territories (47).
- DE partners & state agencies mobilize to establish ADRC in DE

2008 (July - September)

DSAAPD applies for/does not receive federal funds for an ADRC.

2009 (January – October)

- DSAAPD works with national technical support team to assess readiness & develop plans for a DE-ADRC.
- DSAAPD & partners engage in research & training to prepare for the implementation of a statewide ADRC.
- DSAAPD applies for/receives AOA grant to establish a DE-ADRC.
- DSAAPD initiates plans to establish a Delaware ADRC.

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2009 Delaware ADRC Grant Award Details

Project/Budget Period: 36 months. Budget certified for 1st year only; 2nd & 3rd year funding dependent on availability of funds.

FY 2009 Plan: FY 2009 amount of Federal funding (\$228,854.) is less than amount requested; adjustments reflect a maximum FY 2009 funding level. Match requirement lowered to reflect reduced requirement.
