

**I. PURPOSE**

To establish guidelines for recruitment, approval and renewal of Shared Living Providers (SLP) and Respite Providers.

**II. POLICY**

Applicants successfully complete all required training, background checks and satisfy all requirements as set forth by the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services (DDDS) and the Division of Long Term Care Resident Protection (DLTCRP) prior to being approved as a Shared Living or Respite Provider. Shared Living Providers & SL Respite Providers shall maintain compliance with DDDS Shared Living Standards and DLTCRP licensure requirements, as a condition of renewal.

**III. APPLICATION**

Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee  
DDDS Case Managers  
Shared Living Provider Applicants, Shared Living Providers (to include Respite)

**IV. DEFINITIONS**

- A. Difficulty of Care/ICAP money: Money associated with a person's individualized support needs, separate from the established room and board rate. Difficulty of Care money is being replaced with money based on the ICAP (Inventory for Client and Agency Planning) assessment for all individuals who enter the shared living program and those who move to a new residence.
- B. Drug Screening: Drug screening shall minimally test for the presence of the following illegal drugs: 1) marijuana/cannabis; 2) cocaine; 3) opiates; 4) Phencyclidine (PCP); and 5) Amphetamines.
- C. Shared Living: A residential facility that provides shelter and food to more than one person who:
  - a. because of their physical and/or mental condition require a level of care and services suitable to their needs to contribute to their health, comfort, and welfare; and

**IV. DEFINITIONS (continued)**

- b. who are not related within the second degree of consanguinity to the controlling person or persons of the facility.

The facilities to be licensed pursuant to Title 16, Chapter 11 include but are not limited to the following: nursing facilities (commonly referred to as nursing homes); assisted living facilities; intermediate care facilities for persons with mental retardation, neighborhood group homes; family care homes; and rest residential facilities .

- D. Shared Living Applicant Review Panel: The DDDS Director of Residential Development or his/her designee, a Shared Living Coordinator (chair of the panel) and the Regional Program Director or his/her designee within the respective county in which the S.L. applicant resides. The panel is charged with reviewing the application related information presented by the Shared Living Coordinator, interviewing the Shared Living Provider applicant and determining whether to accept or not accept the application.
- E. Respite: A scheduled time of relief for families caring for an individual with a developmental disability. Respite has a starting and ending date.

**V. STANDARDS**

- A. Recruitment shall be an ongoing activity that may include, but is not limited to:
  - 1. Media advertisement;
  - 2. Community education and awareness presentations;
  - 3. Development and dissemination of information booklets, etc.
- B. A provider who supports more than one (1) adult individual shall meet the requirements of the Division of Long Term Care Resident Protection, in addition to meeting the contractual requirements of DDDS. Providers shall be licensed by DLTCRP as required by Delaware law.
- C. Prior to approving an applicant as a provider, the Shared Living Coordinator shall ensure that they:
  - 1. Comply with DDDS program standards;
  - 2. Complete or supply the following information:
    - a) Shared Living/Respite Application;
    - b) Signed Authorization for Release of Information Form;
    - c) Tuberculosis test results for members of the provider's household who are 18 years or older;
    - d) Attendance and successful completion of Provider Training Program;
    - e) State Criminal Background Checks on applicant, spouse/domestic partner residing in the home;
    - f) Drug screening results for the applicant;
    - g) Adult Abuse Registry Check completed for all members of the household who have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday;
    - h) Child Protection Registry Check for all members of the household who have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday;

V. **STANDARDS** *(continued)*

- i) Credit report from either Experian, TransUnion or Equifax which is current within 365 days.
- D. Criminal Background reports shall be reviewed in accordance with the standards set forth by Division of Long Term Care Residents Protection (DLTCRP) Criminal Background Check Unit Disqualifying Crimes Conviction/Time Parameters.
- E. The Shared Living Coordinator/Designee shall coordinate the Provider Training Program for prospective providers. The training program shall include but not be limited to the following courses:
1. Orientation & Training
  2. Dietary Awareness
  3. New Visions I
  4. New Visions II
  5. Home Fire Safety
  6. Health Awareness
  7. Infection Control
  8. Assistance with Medications
  9. CPR/Adult Heart Saver
  10. First Aid
  11. Positive Behavior Supports
  12. Case Management/Record-keeping
  13. Wrap-Up (to also include a review of program standards and Shared Living Mutual Agreement)
- F. The Shared Living Coordinator/Designee shall conduct a home investigation to be documented on the Home Investigation Report.
- G. The Shared Living Coordinator shall assist the applicant to complete a standard suspension request of the DDDS Shared Living Standards, as appropriate. DDDS shall not grant requests for deviations from the Rest Family Care Home license, rather the applicant shall be referred to the Division of Long Term Care Resident Protection (DLTCRP).
- H. A panel consisting of the Director of Residential Development or his/her designee, the Regional Shared Living Coordinator (chair) and the Regional Program Director or his/her designee, of the county in which the applicant lives, shall convene to review the application, training information, the home investigation and all background checks, credit report and reference information.
- I. The panel shall interview the Shared Living provider applicant following a structured process that is developed by the Shared Living Unit.
- J. Based on the information learned in the aforementioned items (standards G and H), the panel shall determine whether or not to enter into a contractual agreement with the applicant.

**V. STANDARDS (continued)**

- K. The Shared Living Coordinator (SLC) shall offer an approved Shared Living Provider the opportunity to sign a DDDS respite/ELA contract.
- L. The Shared Living Coordinator /Designee shall maintain all provider files.
- M. A copy of all correspondence sent to providers relative to negative performance shall be forwarded to the Regional Shared Living Coordinator.
- N. Additional training of the Shared Living Provider shall be required if necessary to support individuals with more complex behavioral, psychiatric and/or physical needs. This determination shall be identified by the ID team.
- O. The following training shall minimally be required of Shared Living Providers/Respite providers as a contingency to contract renewal:
  - a. Recertification of Assistance with Medication;
  - b. Maintain current CPR certification; as certified by either the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association or the National Safety Council;
  - c. annual rights review training (part of New Visions I during application process);
  - d. six (6) hours of approved training per contract year, in addition to the required certification(s); and
  - e. First Aid re-certification as required by the accrediting body
- P. Shared Living/Respite/Provider training shall be tracked by the Training and Professional Development (TAPD) Department.

**VI. PROCEDURES**

**Recruitment & Approval of Shared Living Applicants**

<b>Responsibility</b>	<b>Action</b>
Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	1. Develops and implements recruitment activities.
	2. Responds to all inquiries about the Shared Living/Respite programs.
	3. Maintains monthly recruitment log of inquiries received about the Shared Living/Respite programs.
	4. Forwards the aforementioned information to the Director of Residential Development, on a monthly basis.
	5. Disseminates Information Booklet, Application and Authorization to Release Information Form to interested individuals.
	6. Reviews all Shared Living/Respite Applications received to ensure completeness.

**VI. PROCEDURES (continued)**

**Recruitment & Approval of Shared Living Applicants**

Responsibility	Action
	7. Follow-up with the applicant(s) to coordinate activities necessary to complete the application.
	8. Coordinates applicant attendance at all required orientation and training classes.
	9. Reviews provider applicant qualifications and ensures compliance with Shared Living/Respite program standards via home investigation, State Criminal Background Check, Drug Screening, Adult Abuse Check, Child Protection Registry Check, references (employment and personal), TB screening, etc. 10. Ensures that provider applicant provides a credit report, current within 365 days, from TransUnion, Experian or Equifax. Assists the applicant, as needed, to secure a free credit report at: ( <a href="https://www.annualcreditreport.com/cra/index.jsp">https://www.annualcreditreport.com/cra/index.jsp</a> ).
	11. Assists the Shared Living Provider applicant to complete a Standard Suspension request, as warranted.

**Review Procedure for Disposition of Application**

Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	1. Compiles Shared Living/Respite Application, Home Investigation, verification of completed required training, outcome of drug screening(s), criminal background checks(s), Adult Abuse Registry checks(s), Child Protection registry checks(s), credit report and personal reference interviews/statements.
Shared Living Unit Supervisor	2. Assembles the Shared Living Applicant Review Panel to review the aforementioned documents, interview the applicant and make a determination relative to the Shared Living application.

**VI. PROCEDURES (continued)**

**On-Going Monitoring of Shared Living/Respite Provider**

<b>Responsibility</b>	<b>Action</b>
Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	1. Completes Standards Compliance Checklist on an annual basis, prior to contract renewal.
	2. Completes Compliance Plan, as warranted, and forwards to the respective Regional Program Director. Maintains one copy and provides one copy to the Shared Living Provider.
Regional Program Director	3. Disseminates the Compliance Plan accordingly for the purpose of coordinating corrective action(s).
Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	4. Monitors status of Compliance Plan prior to target date for completion.
Shared Living/Respite Supervisor	5. Sends SLP written notice that advises him/her: 1) that Difficulty of Care/ICAP money will be withheld (and not reimbursed) until the pay cycle following compliance with the plan.
Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	6. Forwards training documentation (preferably the sign-in roster) to TAPD Administrative Assistant.
TAPD Administrative Assistant/Designee	7. Enters training information into applicable data base.
	8. Compiles and distributes quarterly provider training report to the Regional Shared Living Coordinator.
	9. If training report indicates non-compliance, repeat step #2-4..
DDDS Case Manager	10. Notifies the Regional Shared Living Coordinator as soon as they are notified of a provider potential move.
Regional Shared Living Coordinator/Designee	11. Completes environmental section of the Standards Compliance Checklist within 10 calendar days of a move.

**VI. PROCEDURES (continued)**

**On-Going Monitoring of Shared Living/Respite Provider**

	12. Repeat step # 2-4 if Standards Compliance Checklist indicates deficiency(ies).
Shared Living/Respite Supervisor	13. Sends SLP a 30 day written notice to terminate (or not renew) the Shared Living Contract if compliance is not achieved in accordance with the Compliance Plan.

**VII. SYNOPSIS**

This policy replaces the February 2004 policy entitled Recruitment and Approval Process of Foster/Respite Care applicants. Significant revisions included replacing the term “foster care” to “shared living”, a change in the format and content to the standards and compliance checklist, the use of the DLTCRP requirements determining if a criminal background check is acceptable and the use of a panel to approve/disapprove applicants, among a number of other changes.

1.0	Areas of the home that are not bedrooms (as described in this document) may not be used for sleeping purposes.			
1.1	Bedrooms must be outside rooms and must allow for privacy.			
1.2	Each bedroom must have four (4) walls that reach from the floor to the ceiling.			
1.3	The bedroom door must open directly into a corridor or hallway and must be able to be opened or closed from either direction.			
1.4	Each bedroom must have at least one window which can be used as an emergency exit.			
1.5	The size of a bedroom must be a minimum of 70 square feet in size.			
1.6	Bedrooms shall have adequate electrical outlets which meet the Delaware Code requirements.			
1.7	There shall be at least one (1) light fixture at the entrance of each bedroom.			
1.8	There shall be adequate closet space, a bureau and or/ chest of drawers for storage of the individuals' clothing/personal belongings.			
1.9	There shall be a bedside stand, a chair, and a reading light in the bedroom for the individual.			
1.10	The physical structure of the home shall be arranged to promote family integration.			
1.11	Dining and living areas of the home shall be large enough to ensure inclusion of the individual and family members.			
1.12	The house shall have a minimum of two (2) means of egress.			
1.13	In the bathroom, there shall be at least one (1) window or mechanical ventilation system to the outdoors.			
1.14	The home shall have sewage disposal/septic systems which comply with the Division of Natural Resources and Environmental Control.			
1.15	All habitable rooms shall have at least one (1) window with a screen.

1.16	The temperature in all living areas shall be maintained within the range of 67-75 degrees and such shall be comfortable to the individual.			

## SECTION II- HEALTH AND SAFETY

2.0	The Shared Living Provider (SLP) shall maintain a disaster supply kit that minimally includes a 5 day supply of non-perishable food, water and medications, a flash light with operable batteries, a first aid kit, a battery operated radio, insurance information, family contact information and other items as required by DDDS.			
2.1	There shall be transportation available on a twenty-four (24) hour basis.			
2.2	There shall be a telephone (in working order) in the home.			
2.3	The furnishings/furniture shall be arranged to ensure accessibility by the individual.			
2.4	All individuals receiving services shall be registered with the applicable 911 call board.			
2.5	The SLP shall be responsible for the health and safety of the individual in their home; including during times of disaster.			
2.6	Furnishing and housekeeping shall be maintained to present a clean, orderly appearance.			
2.7	The home shall be equipped with a carbon monoxide detector if heating sources other than electric or heat-pump are used.			
2.8	The house shall have smoke detection devices, either photo-electric or ionization type, capable of automatically sensing visible or invisible particles of combustion and which activates an alarm sufficiently audible to warn occupants of the house of an impending danger of fire or hazard to life.			
2.9	A battery powered smoke detection device shall be installed, as back-up, if the home is equipped with hard-wired, interconnected smoke detection devices in the vicinity of the bedroom(s).			
2.10	Smoke detectors shall be located as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. on each level of the home; including basements and attics</li> <li>b. outside of each sleeping areas in the immediate vicinity of bedrooms;</li> <li>c. in stairwells located to ensure that smoke rising will activate the detector (i.e., no obstruction).</li> </ul>			
2.11	Smoke detectors shall be mounted on the ceiling at least four (4) inches from a wall or on a wall with the top of the detector not less than 4 inches or more than 12 inches from the ceiling.			
2.12	The home shall have a written evacuation plan with the outdoor meeting area identified, posted in a conspicuous location.			
2.13	There shall be an operable 2.5-5 pound ABC fire extinguisher in the home.			
2.14	The water system shall provide healthy, drinkable water.

2.15	The water system shall also provide adequate hot and cold water under pressure. The hot water temperature shall not exceed 115 degrees.			
2.16	The toilet and bathtub/shower shall have a substantial handgrip, if required by the individual.			
2.17	There shall be at least one (1) refrigerator and one (1) freezer, in proper working order, capable of maintaining frozen foods in the frozen state and refrigerated foods within the range of 33-41 degrees Fahrenheit.			
2.18	There shall be at least one (1) four-burner range and one (1) oven (or combination) in proper working order.			
2.19	There shall be adequate lighting in the home.			
2.20	Kerosene space heaters shall <b>never</b> be used.			
2.21	All rooms shall have at least one ventilation source.			
2.22	Outdoor yard space shall be free from hazards and debris.			
2.23	Stairways shall have handrails for safety.			
2.24	Stairways shall provide for adequate lighting with light switches at the top and bottom.			
2.25	Non-skid surfaces shall cover stairways.			
2.26	Floors, stairways, walls, ceilings and other surfaces shall be kept clean, obstruction free and in good repair.			
2.27	Floors surfaces shall not be slippery. Throw rugs shall be maintained in good condition (i.e., free of hazards such as curled edges & rips) so as not to cause falls.			
2.28	All interior doors shall be capable of being opened from either side.			
2.29	Emergency telephone numbers for ambulance, fire, police, poison control centers and DDDS emergency on-call contact numbers shall be posted and readily available.			
2.30	Vehicles used to provide transportation shall comply with all applicable laws established by the Division of Motor Vehicles and the Delaware Code.			
2.31	There shall be at least one (1) sanitary trash or garbage receptacle located in the home.			
2.32	There shall be laundry facilities located within the home (or easily accessible to the home).			
2.33	Each home shall have adequate and separate areas for storage of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. food items;</li> <li>b. cleaning products, disinfectants, and polishes;</li> <li>c. poisons, sprays or other chemicals;</li> <li>d. eating and serving utensils, pots, pans and other cooking items.</li> </ul>			
2.34	There shall be at least two (2) sets of bed linens and towels, for each individual.			
2.35	A separate pillow and blanket shall be provided for each individual.			
2.36	Bed linens and towels shall be changed at least one (1) time per week or more frequently if required to maintain them in a sanitary condition.

2.37	The home shall be free from insect/rodent infestation.			
2.38	Foods provided shall be in sufficient amounts for meals and snacks and be representative of a nutritional diet (i.e., 3 meals).			
2.39	Any dietary deviations from a medically prescribed diet shall have prior approval from the physician, dietician or DDDS nurse.			
2.40	The SLP shall obtain a written order, from the physician or licensed prescribing medical professional, prior to assisting the individual with a prescription or non-prescription medication. The physician's order shall be maintained in the Provider's notebook.			
2.41	The SLP shall immediately report any adverse medication side effects to the prescribing physician and then to the DDDS nurse or emergency on-call worker. Written documentation of adverse side effects shall be maintained in the provider's notebook and made available to the DDDS nurse.			
2.42	The SLP shall report medication errors immediately, using the emergency on-call system if necessary.			
2.43	The following screening of shared living applicants and/or adult members of the applicant's home shall be satisfactorily completed prior to engaging in a contractual agreement with the DDDS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. State Criminal Background Check on applicant and spouse/domestic partner living in the home;</li> <li>b. drug screening on the applicant to minimally include a test for the presence of marijuana/cannabis, cocaine, opiates, Phenyclidine (PCP) and amphetamines;</li> <li>c. **SECTION I- ENVIRONMENT**

1.0	Areas of the home that are not bedrooms (as described in this document) may not be used for sleeping purposes.
1.1	Bedrooms must be outside rooms and must allow for privacy.
1.2	Each bedroom must have four (4) walls that reach from the floor to the ceiling.
1.3	The bedroom door must open directly into a corridor or hallway and must be able to be opened or closed from either direction.
1.4	Each bedroom must have at least one window which can be used as an emergency exit.
1.5	The size of a bedroom must be a minimum of 70 square feet in size.
1.6	Bedrooms shall have adequate electrical outlets which meet the Delaware Code requirements.
1.7	There shall be at least one (1) light fixture at the entrance of each bedroom.
1.8	There shall be adequate closet space, a bureau and or/ chest of drawers for storage of the individuals' clothing/personal belongings.
1.9	There shall be a bedside stand, a chair, and a reading light in the bedroom for the individual.
1.10	The physical structure of the home shall be arranged to promote family integration.
1.11	Dining and living areas of the home shall be large enough to ensure inclusion of the individual and family members.
1.12	The house shall have a minimum of two (2) means of egress.
1.13	In the bathroom, there shall be at least one (1) window or mechanical ventilation system to the outdoors.
1.14	The home shall have sewage disposal/septic systems which comply with the Division of Natural Resources and Environmental Control.
1.15	All habitable rooms shall have at least one (1) window with a screen.
1.16	The temperature in all living areas shall be maintained within the range of 67-75 degrees and such shall be comfortable to the individual.

**SECTION II- HEALTH AND SAFETY**

2.0	The Shared Living Provider (SLP) shall maintain a disaster supply kit that minimally includes a 5 day supply of non-perishable food, water and medications, a flash light with operable batteries, a first aid kit, a battery operated radio, insurance information, family contact information and other items as required by DDDS.
2.1	There shall be transportation available on a twenty-four (24) hour basis.
2.2	There shall be a telephone (in working order) in the home.
2.3	The furnishings/furniture shall be arranged to ensure accessibility by the individual.

2.4	All individuals receiving services shall be registered with the applicable 911 call board.
2.5	The SLP shall be responsible for the health and safety of the individual in their home; including during times of disaster.
2.6	Furnishing and housekeeping shall be maintained to present a clean, orderly appearance.
2.7	The home shall be equipped with a carbon monoxide detector if heating sources other than electric or heat pump are used.
2.8	The house shall have smoke detection devices, either photo-electric or ionization type, capable of automatically sensing visible or invisible particles of combustion and which activates an alarm sufficiently audible to warn occupants of the house of an impending danger of fire or hazard to life.
2.9	A battery powered smoke detection device shall be installed, as back-up, if the home is equipped with hard-wired, interconnected smoke detection devices in the vicinity of the bedroom(s).
2.10	Smoke detectors shall be located as follows: d. on each level of the home; including basements and attics e. outside of each sleeping areas in the immediate vicinity of bedrooms; f. in stairwells located to ensure that smoke rising will activate the detector (i.e., no obstruction).
2.11	Smoke detectors shall be mounted on the ceiling at least four (4) inches from a wall or on a wall with the top of the detector not less than 4 inches or more than 12 inches from the ceiling.
2.12	The home shall have a written evacuation plan with the outdoor meeting area identified, posted in a conspicuous location.
2.13	There shall be an operable 2.5-5 pound ABC fire extinguisher in the home.
2.14	The water system shall provide healthy, drinkable water.
2.15	The water system shall also provide adequate hot and cold water under pressure. The hot water temperature shall not exceed 115 degrees.
2.16	The toilet and bathtub/shower shall have a substantial handgrip, if required by the individual.
2.17	There shall be at least one (1) refrigerator and one (1) freezer, in proper working order, capable of maintaining frozen foods in the frozen state and refrigerated foods within the range of 33-41 degrees Fahrenheit.
2.18	There shall be at least one (1) four-burner range and one (1) oven (or combination) in proper working order.
2.19	There shall be adequate lighting in the home.
2.20	Kerosene space heaters shall <b>never</b> be used.
2.21	All rooms shall have at least one ventilation source.
2.22	Outdoor yard space shall be free from hazards and debris.
2.23	Stairways shall have handrails for safety.
2.24	Stairways shall provide for adequate lighting with light switches at the top and bottom.
2.25	Non-skid surfaces shall cover stairways.
2.26	Floors, stairways, walls, ceilings and other surfaces shall be kept clean, obstruction free and in good repair.
2.27	Floors surfaces shall not be slippery. Throw rugs shall be maintained in good condition (i.e., free of hazards such as curled edges & rips) so as not to cause falls.
2.28	All interior doors shall be capable of being opened from either side.
2.29	Emergency telephone numbers for ambulance, fire, police, poison control centers and DDDS emergency on-call contact numbers shall be posted and readily available.
2.30	Vehicles used to provide transportation shall comply with all applicable laws established by the Division of Motor Vehicles and the Delaware Code.
2.31	There shall be at least one (1) sanitary trash or garbage receptacle located in the home.

2.32	There shall be laundry facilities located within the home (or easily accessible to the home).
2.33	Each home shall have adequate and separate areas for storage of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>e. food items;</li> <li>f. cleaning products, disinfectants, and polishes;</li> <li>g. poisons, sprays or other chemicals;</li> <li>h. eating and serving utensils, pots, pans and other cooking items.</li> </ul>
2.34	There shall be at least two (2) sets of bed linens and towels, for each individual.
2.35	A separate pillow and blanket shall be provided for each individual.
2.36	Bed linens and towels shall be changed at least one (1) time per week or more frequently if required to maintain them in a sanitary condition.
2.37	The home shall be free from insect/rodent infestation.
2.38	Foods provided shall be in sufficient amounts for meals and snacks and be representative of a nutritional diet (i.e., 3 meals).
2.39	Any dietary deviations from a medically prescribed diet shall have prior approval from the physician, dietician or DDDS nurse.
2.40	The SLP shall obtain a written order, from the physician or licensed prescribing medical professional, prior to assisting the individual with a prescription or non-prescription medication. The physician's order shall be maintained in the Provider's notebook.
2.41	The SLP shall immediately report any adverse medication side effects to the prescribing physician and then to the DDDS nurse or emergency on-call worker. Written documentation of adverse side effects shall be maintained in the provider's notebook and made available to the DDDS nurse.
2.42	The SLP shall report medication errors immediately, using the emergency on-call system if necessary.
2.43	The following screening of shared living applicants and/or adult members of the applicant's home shall be satisfactorily completed prior to engaging in a contractual agreement with the DDDS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>e. State Criminal Background Check on applicant and spouse/domestic partner living in the home;</li> <li>f. drug screening on the applicant to minimally include a test for the presence of marijuana/cannabis, cocaine, opiates, Phenyyclidine (PCP) and amphetamines;</li> <li>g. Adult Abuse Registry Check for all members of the household who have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday;</li> <li>h. Child Protection Registry Check for all members of the household who have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.</li> </ul>

3.8	The SLP shall not provide residential services to individuals not in the DDDS registry.
3.9	The SLP shall have no boarders living in the home.
3.10	SLPs shall be considered contractors of the State of Delaware; not employees
3.11	All members of the SLP's household shall agree to accept the individual into their home.
3.12	All members of the SLP's family shall treat the individual with respect and dignity at all times.
3.13	The SLP shall be responsible for the health, safety and welfare of persons in their home who receive services from the DDDS.
3.14	The SLP shall ensure the provision of competent adult supervision at all times or in accordance with the individual's Essential Lifestyle Plan.
3.15	The SLP shall be able to proficiently read and write English and keep records to the degree necessary to satisfy the operational demands of his/her position.
3.16	The SLP shall proficiently complete the minimum required training (as per DDDS policy) per contact year.
3.17	The SLP shall provide transportation for all services needed by the individual (medical, dental, psychiatric, etc.).
3.18	The SLP shall schedule appointments that are required by the individual and ensure attendance at these appointments, as requested by an ID team member or other clinician.
