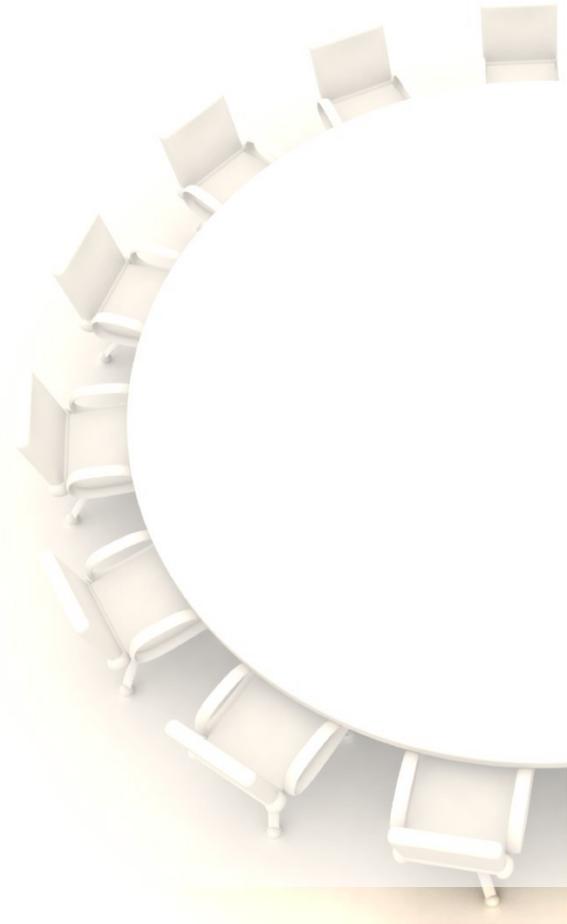

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We have accomplished a lot over the past year and pace of work has accelerated

July – Nov 2014

- Held first Board meeting

Nov 2014 – Jan 2015

- Continued planning and setup while awaiting grant award decision and beginning of grant period of performance

Feb 2015 – present

- Finalized measures for initial version of Common Scorecard and began visits to participating pilot practices
- Defined milestones for practice transformation, published consensus paper, and developed input into request for proposals
- Aligned on priority themes for Healthy Neighborhoods and measures for Population Health Scorecard
- Determined elements of value-based payment models that would benefit from cross-payer standardization
- Finalized input for Health Professionals Consortium request for proposals
- Provided consumer input to other committees (e.g., Healthy Neighborhood) and helped craft consumer outreach materials

Common Scorecard testing update

Progress to releasing Version 1

- DHIN is currently testing necessary components of the Scorecard for release:
 - Scorecard environment
 - Metrics data
 - Provider registration process
- Formalizing approval for development of attribution list functionality
- Scorecard release to providers is scheduled to occur in late July

Feedback process

- Confirmed 12 visits with participating practices; three have been conducted to date
- Engaged in active feedback process with providers in advance of visits, including addressing detailed questions raised by six practices via email
- Scheduled webinar for participating practices for July 20th

Will determine how to continue active dialogue with participating practices for continued input

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For reference: Investments and funding

DISCUSSED AT FEB 2015 BOARD MEETING

Investments (4-year total 2015-2018)¹

- \$28m for detailed design, IT development, and implementation support
- \$23m in operations, evaluation, and continuous improvement from DHIN, DCHI, HCC, local payers, providers, other stakeholders
- \$8.5m in practice transformation support
- \$60m in care coordination payments to PCPs or affiliated groups, systems
- \$7m in Workforce programs and initiatives
- \$3.6m in Healthy Neighborhoods programs

Sources of funding (2015-2018)

- \$35m federal SIM grant
- \$20m other federal (MCaid, HRSA)
- \$60m Medicare, Medicaid, and Commercial payers
- \$4m philanthropic foundations
- \$3-4m “in kind” time of stakeholders
- \$8m stakeholder contributions

Total investment of approximately \$130 million over 4 years

¹ Grant period is February 2015 – January 2019

DCHI financial roles in SIM program

Role	Description
Manager of own budget	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ DCHI has primary accountability for the fiscal stewardship of its own budget ▪ DCHI seeks stakeholder contributions and foundation / corporate grants, sets annual budget, and manages to financial estimates ▪ Monies used for operations of DCHI organization
Advocate for DCHI position	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ DCHI builds and publishes consensus positions on SIM issues and advises, educates, and provides insights ▪ Other stakeholders (e.g., HCC, payers, providers) have primary accountability for fiscal stewardship and take DCHI positions into account as they execute on SIM-related efforts

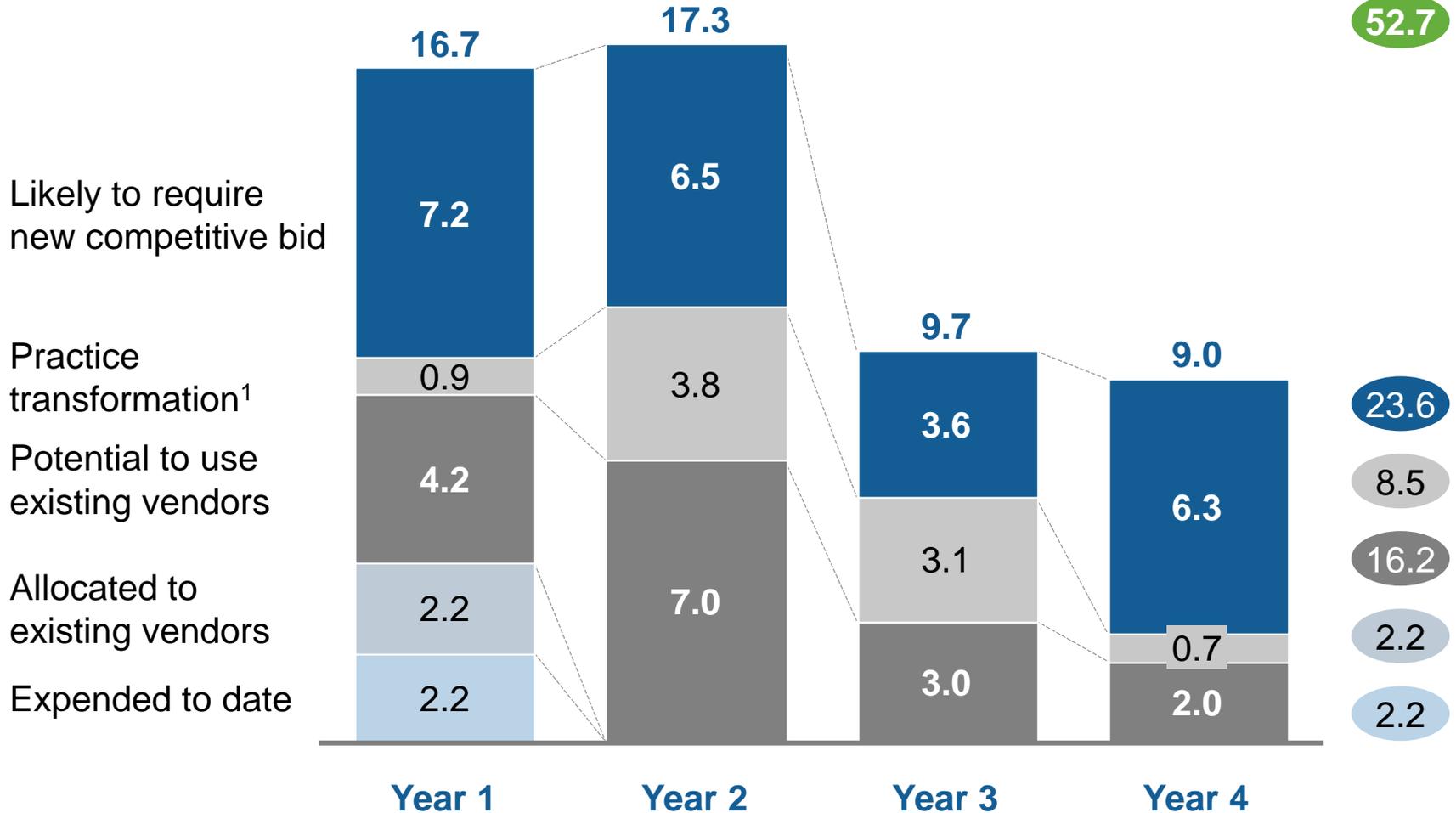
