

The Community Health Needs Assessment: How, Who and Why???

- Step 1: Identify the population that needs to be assessed
 - windshield survey, stakeholders
- Step 2: Identification of health priorities
 - data sources, surveys, focus groups, key informant interviews
- Step 3: Assessment of the health priorities for action.
 - honing in on the disparities
- Step 4: Action planning to implement identified strategies

CHNA METHODOLOGY For Healthier Sussex County

- 1. Using common community survey and Stakeholder/Focus Group Questionnaires
 - Available in English and Spanish.
 - Distribute at Community Events, Direct Mail to Key Groups, and Online

- 2. Information to be compiled collaboratively and shared amongst three hospitals
- 3. Recommend combined report/implementation plan for Healthier Sussex County**
- 4. Final report written made available to the public via the Healthier Sussex County and DE Health Tracker websites
