Health Resources Management Plan (HRMP) Update June 1, 2017

Background

- Joint Sunset Committee (JSC) in 2012 issued recommendations and opportunities for improvement to the Health Resources Board (HRB):
 - A comprehensive review of the HRMP and update to ensure it supports the development of health services that are cost effective, meet consumer needs and choice and that CPR Standards are appropriate.
 - Establish rules and regulations published in accordance with the procedures specified in the Administrative Procedures Act (29 Del C. c. 101) for reviewing Certificate of Public Review applications.
 - Review and revise the by-laws.

HRMP

- Establishes the core set of common review considerations for use in reviewing CPR applications.
- The proposed document seeks to better align with the state's goal of achieving the "Triple Aim Plus One":
 - 1. Improve population health
 - 2. Improve patient experience (quality & satisfaction)
 - 3. Reduce Costs; *plus*,
 - 4. Enhance provider experience.

HRMP Revision Phases

Phase I
Revisions that do not require legislative changes to Title 16 Del. C. §9303.

Phase II (and future phases)
 Revisions that require legislative changes to Title16 Del.
 C. §9303.

HRMP Revisions Timeline

- The HRMP revision process has been underway since December 2015

 - November 2016 (Register of Regulations Posting)
 - December 2016 (Public Hearings)
 - January 2017
 - April 2017

Phase I HRMP Revision Highlights

- Alignment with the SIM Plan and health care reform.
- Addition of guiding principles to align with statutory criteria.
- Expanded charity care section.
- Modified nursing home bed mathematical projections.
- Expanded to include detail on the Major Medical Equipment section, previously only on the HRB website.
- Updated supporting resources which may be of assistance to applicants during the preparation of a CPR application.
- Streamlined application processes to include Document Property Guidelines.



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
