Project CAPABLE Background

Dr. Sarah Szanton, RN at Johns Hopkins, continuing a six-year study

Goals: 1) Keeping aged in their homes longer

2) Reducing hospitalizations of the aged

Patients: Baltimore inner-city poor

Visiting Team: Nurse, Occupational Therapist, Handyman

Cost per individual/home: \$3.3K.

\$3.3K. cost per person vs significant Medicaid savings by the state!

CMS partially funding study and plans 2015 nationwide adoption (Medicaid)

2015 Delaware Proposal

Develop state-wide effort to implement Project CAPABLE

- Private sector and government with DHSS lead

Hold "Aging in Place" series of Community Forums in Summer/Fall, 2015

- Start program with a Dr. Szanton 20 minute Project CAPABLE overview
- Follow with 15/20 minute implementation plans by:

DHSS, CCVNA, Univ. of DE, Hospitals, Others

One or two forums in each county

2015 continuation of 2008 to 2014 "Imagine Delaware" series of programs
