

BSA+A Person-Centered Feasibility Study for DHCI


Findings

- Equipment (boiler, HVAC, plumbing, etc.) past its useful life
- Asbestos and pest contamination evident
- Facilities do not promote a home-like environment


Recommendations

- Allocate funding for short-term renovations
- Allocate funding for long-term renovations
- Construct a new building with consolidated services on campus




DHCl User Group Engagement New Construction for Home-like Skilled Nursing Facility




The New DHCI

- 3-Level Building, maximizing natural light and landscaping
- 216 additional parking spaces, 10 of which are Electrical Vehicle (EV) charging stations
- 121,220 square feet of consolidated clinical and residential services (social meeting areas, laundry, food services, adaptive equipment, wound care, therapies, Snoezelen rooms, satellite pharmacy, quiet room, chapel, etc.)
- Break ground fall of '24, completion fall of '26
- 120 Beds (occupancy includes 90 double, 20 single, and 10 bariatric)




