National Influenza Synopsis 2018-2019:

National data are updated Friday of each week. Please visit <u>http://www.cdc.gov/flu/weekly/</u> for the most current information. During MMWR Week 1 (December 30, 2018 – January 5, 2019) influenza activity remains elevated in the United States. Influenza A(H1N1)pdm09, influenza A(H3N2), and influenza B viruses continue to co-circulate.. Geographic spread during week 01 is: <u>Widespread influenza activity</u> was reported by 30 states (Alabama, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Utah, Vermont, Virginia and Wyoming). <u>Regional influenza activity</u> was reported by Puerto Rico and 17 states (Arkansas, Georgia, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin). <u>Local influenza activity</u> was reported by two states (Hawaii and Mississippi). <u>Sporadic influenza activity</u> was reported by two states are received.

Delaware Influenza Surveillance 2018-2019:

During MMWR Week 1, there were 195 laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza reported among Delaware residents, bringing the total to 883 for the 2018-2019 season. Reports of influenza-like illness (ILI) received from participating providers, facilities and institutions in Delaware show ILI is 0.75% compared with Delaware's 2018-2019 baseline of 2.0%. Nationally, ILI decreased from 4.0% to 3.5%, but remains above the national baseline of 2.2%.

Level of Influenza Activity in Delaware, MMWR Week 1:

 Widespread
 Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in the state.

 Influenza-like illness (ILI) is defined as patients presenting with fever of 100° F or greater, cough and/or sore throat in the absence of a known cause other than influenza.

No Activity: No laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza and no reported increase in the number of cases of ILI.

Sporadic: Small numbers of laboratory-confirmed influenza cases or a single laboratory-confirmed influenza outbreak has been reported, but there is no increase in cases of ILI.

Local: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in a single region of the state.

Regional: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least two but less than half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in those regions.³

Widespread: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in the state.

¹ 2018-2019 Region 3 (DE, DC, MD, PA, VA and WV) baseline = 2.0%.

² Laboratory-confirmed case = case confirmed by viral culture or PCR.

³ Region = population under surveillance in a defined geographical subdivision of a state. Regions typically include several counties. Regional doesn't apply to states with < four counties.



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



U.S. Outpatient Influenza-Like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) Sentinel Providers


An ILINet (sentinel) provider conducts surveillance for influenza-like illness (ILI) in collaboration with the Delaware Division of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Data reported by ILINet providers, in combination with other influenza surveillance data, provide a national and statewide picture of influenza activity in the U.S.



¹ ILINet reporting partners include long-term care facilities, colleges / universities, correctional facilities and daycare facilities.





Summary of Worldwide Influenza Activity

Worldwide, seasonal influenza A viruses accounted for the majority of detections. In the temperate zone of the northern hemisphere influenza activity continued to increase slowly. In temperate zones of the southern hemisphere, influenza activity returned to inter-seasonal levels with exception of some parts in Australia.

In North America influenza activity continued to increase overall with influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 predominating.

Overall, influenza activity increased in the United States and Canada, with influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 predominating.

In México, high influenza-associated SARI activity was reported with predominance of influenza A(H1N1)pdm09.

In the Caribbean, influenza virus activity decreased and higher RSV activity was reported throughout most of the sub-region. In Cuba and Haiti, high SARI activity was due to influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 circulation.

In Central America, epidemiologic indicators remained at moderate levels and influenza activity decreased throughout the sub-region with influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 and B co-circulating. In Panama and Guatemala RSV circulation continued elevated. In Costa Rica and Nicaragua, moderate pneumonia and SARI activity were reported with increased influenza and RSV circulation.

In Europe, influenza activity increased, with both A viruses circulating.

In Western Asia, some countries reached medium levels of influenza intensity. Elevated but decreasing influenza activity continued to be reported across countries of the Arabian Peninsula. In East Asia, influenza season appeared to have started, with predominantly influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 detected. In Southern Asia, influenza detections rose sharply in recent weeks mainly due to increased influenza A(H3N2) detections in Iran and continued influenza A(H1N1)pdm09 detections in India.
