- Fluoride supplements are available for children between 6 and 16 if their drinking water does not contain fluoride. Ask your doctor or dentist about fluoride for your child.
- Fluoridated drinking water prevents tooth decay. It is safe and effective. Fluoride benefits everyone.
- Not all well water contains fluoride. Not all water departments fluoridate their systems.
- Dentists recommend drinking fluoridated water and using fluoride toothpaste twice a day.
