#### **Diabetes Expo Nov. 1 at Dover Downs**

The 15th Annual Diabetes Wellness Expo will be held on Nov. 1 at Dover Downs Conference Center, located at 1131 N. DuPont Hwy. in Dover, Delaware. Approximately 400 people are expected to attend this free event sponsored by the Delaware Diabetes Coalition and others, including the Division of Public Health (DPH).

Between 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m., Delawareans can attend educational presentations on diabetes management that cover services, resources, and tips on controlling the disease. Vendors share available diabetes care products and services. Screenings include blood glucose, blood pressure, foot care, and eye exams. Free flu shots will be offered. A box lunch including a gourmet sandwich, fruit, and beverage will be provided on a first come, first served basis.

DPH Director Dr. Karyl Rattay will give remarks at noon.

More than 20 sites statewide will accept unused and expired prescription drugs on Saturday, Oct. 22, National Drug Take-Back Day.

Between 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m., Delawareans can anonymously drop off their unused drugs in pill bottles, boxes, blister packs, or sealed plastic bags.



Leave liquid medications in original containers, and do not bring needles, aerosols, or biohazard materials. No questions will be asked. Visit <u>delawarehealthyhomes.org</u> for a list of sites.

# **DPH** announces flu clinic schedule

DPH urges all Delawareans 6 months of age and older who have not yet been vaccinated against the flu to get a flu vaccination as soon as possible. View the flu clinic schedule at <u>flu.delaware.gov</u> or call DPH at 888-282-8672. DPH will hold two large flu clinics that offer free flu vaccine:

- Oct. 6, 2016, 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m., Porter State Service Center, 509 W. 8th Street, Wilmington, Delaware 19801. Public Health nurses will administer intramuscular flu vaccine to Delawareans ages 9 years and older. Bilingual staff in Spanish will be on site.
- Oct. 27, 2016, 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Blue Hen Corporate Center, 655 South Bay Road, Dover Delaware 19901. This drivethru clinic also accommodates pedestrians. Public Health nurses will administer intramuscular flu vaccine to Delawareans age 13 years and older. Bilingual staff in Spanish, African, Haitian Creole, and American Sign Language will be on site.

Delawareans with access and functional needs are encouraged to attend. Attendees should wear short sleeve or sleeveless shirts. Leave pets other than service animals at home.
