## IV. Director's Update

Director Newnam and Deputy Director Smith shared a few divisional updates.

## Budget

- Governor recommended budgeting \$1.8m for PAS waitlist. Current need for waitlist is \$1.76m. Possibly use Medicaid surplus funds to address PAS to wipe out entire waitlist.
- Sheila Grant asking about lobbying for additional funds; Teresa stated with these funds it places DSAAPD in a good place budget-wise. Disparity in PAS salaries Sussex County needs monies too. Adding funds to NCC/KC to existing agencies Grant in Aid especially to those who didn't apply is a concern. Grant in Aid will be discussed on June 30.

- HB 115-within two years all scripts will be submitted via electronic means to keep people from stealing script pads to make out own scripts
- HS 1 for HB 123-limited temporary guardianship for those in hospital who don't have permanent guardian; Sheila on task force that is working on similar thing
- HB 146-tighten up insurance to make payments
- SS 1 for SB 92-adult dental care bill a motion to send letter from council to show full support of committee to legislators; Sue/Lindy to work on letter to send to Carolyn
- SB 116-Primary Care reform
- SB 132 w/SA 1-speed up payment of life insurance payouts to 30-60 days
- HB 168-State employee pension raise burial benefits from \$7,000 to \$8,000
- HB 164-rewrite of Delaware Developmental Disability Council
- SB 111-slight changes to same code as HB 164 as it is conflicting
- SB 110-Architectural Accessibility Board ADA compliance
- SB 108-Health Resource Board making more self-sufficient

JY – Asking about HB 133 attempting to put in code making annual budget process part of performance management system. Members need to look at it and decide if Council want to stand against it, send vote to Susan. Also discussed SB 105 introducing \$15/hr. minimum wage.
