

How To Access Publicly Funded Addiction Treatment in Delaware

If you do not have health insurance or have insurance that doesn't fully meet your healthcare needs, you may be eligible for **free addiction treatment services** through Delaware's Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH). Ask your physician to make a referral through the Delaware Treatment and Referral Network (DTRN)/OpenBeds.



Visit or call your local DSAMH Bridge Clinic. Bridge Clinic staff will conduct an assessment and ask you some questions to determine what treatment is right for you. Bridge Clinics can offer short-term counseling, peer support, care coordination, and same- or next day buprenorphine treatment, before linking you with a long-term treatment option.

Most addiction treatment programs start with a **comprehensive assessment** – administered by an addiction specialist or other clinician – to understand your needs and inform your treatment plan. **To get an assessment, call or visit a Bridge Clinic or call the other programs listed on page 3.**

Who can I call if I am in crisis?

What types of programs are available?

Withdrawal management programs

Withdrawal management, formerly known as “detox,” helps you stop using substances in a safe outpatient or inpatient environment.

Residential treatment programs

Residential treatment programs provide counseling, peer support, and structured programming in a residential environment.

Intensive outpatient and other outpatient programs


Outpatient programs provide clinic-based services, including individual and group counseling, peer support, case management, and medications to help you in your recovery.

Sober living programs

Sober living programs provide you with a place to stay and a supportive community while you participate in other outpatient programming.

Many addiction treatment programs include the following services:

Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD):

These highly effective medications – such as methadone, buprenorphine, and naltrexone – help stop your withdrawal symptoms and cravings and are usually prescribed or administered in a clinic setting. The program directory on page 3 indicates which programs provide MOUD with this symbol: .


Case management services: Trained professionals help you gain access to medical, social, and educational services, and other resources.

Peer services: Peer Recovery Specialists support you in your recovery from addiction, mental health conditions, or both. Peer Recovery Specialists are specially trained individuals who have maintained their own successful recovery and help others through shared understanding, respect, and mutual empowerment.

Counseling: Professional counselors help you identify goals and potential solutions to problems you are facing, improve your communication and coping skills, strengthen your self-esteem, and help you make changes in your life that support your mental wellbeing and recovery.

Brandywine Counseling and Community Services provides outreach and supportive services, including sterile injection equipment to individuals to reduce transmission of infectious disease, Naloxone/Narcan, and connection to treatment services, meeting clients without judgment to help them explore available options for increasing safety and accessing care.
