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Dur Mission

The mission of the Office of Radiation Control is to protect the health and safety of Delawareans by regulating the use of ionizing radiation in medicine, industry, research, and education; and to provide health protection resources in the event of a radiological emergency. Radiation Technology Certification is a program that issues state certificates to qualifying technologists and technicians who administer ionizing radiation to human patients in Delaware. This page includes a searchable PDF named "Verification of State Certified Radiation Technologists and Technicians," with certificate status (active expired, or terminated) for individuals such as medical radiologic technologists, dental radiation technicians, radiation therapists, and others



Radiation Machine Registration is a program that issues registration permits to stationary and mobile radiation machine facilities, and conducts inspections to monitor the safety and quality control of ionizing radiation machines. Examples of radiation machines include X-Ray, Computed Tomography (CT), and radiation therapy devices.



Radiation Service Provider Registration is a program that issues registration permits to companies or persons (vendors) who deliver certain radiation-related services to radiation source facilities located in Delaware. This page includes a searchable PDF named "Registered Radiation Service Providers," Radiation-related services include installation, servicing, or calibration of x-ray machines, radiation protection, or health physics consultation, personal dosimetry services, radiation



shielding plans, or practice as a Qualified Medical Physicist.

Radioactive Material Registration is a program that issues registration to facilities that possess, store, use, sell or dispose of radioactive materials. Examples of radioactive materials include radiopharmaceuticals used in nuclear medicine procedures, industrial nuclear
