How does Delaware health care rate in quality measures?

A recent report offers insight into Delaware's performance.

This report was created to collectively gauge the performance of both Highmark Health Options Blue Cross Blue Shield and UnitedHealthcare Community Plan. No measure should be interpreted in isolation. Measures are best understood in the context of other measures. Examining data patterns can provide a more complete picture of performance. Note: Because NCQA does not perform analysis for less than five Medicaid MCOs, Mercer calculated the Delaware rates based on NCQA-certified HEDIS data provided by the MCOs.

About the data: Using 2016 as the measurement year, Mercer used Delaware Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®) results collected by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) to generate a report on Medicaid performance. Delaware, a smaller state, has only two Medicaid Managed Care Organizations (MCQs). This report reflects the data collected from Highmark Health Options Blue Cross Blue Shield and United Healthcare Community Plan. Mercer, rather than NCQA, performed this analysis since NCQA does not calculate competitive statistics for less than five MCQs. National averages were calculated by Mercer and are not certified by NCQA.
