Delaware's State Innovation Model (SIM) Update

Recent areas of focus

- **Common Scorecard enrollment and provider webinars are live** at <http://www.choosehealthde.com/providers>; planned Statewide release in October
- **Payers continuing to roll out value-based payment programs**, with Medicaid pilots live and Commercial programs expected to launch in January
- **Delaware Health Care Claims Database**: Governor signed legislation enabling the database on July 21; DHIN is defining governance and drafting regulations
- **Continuing Community Forums** and developing plans for broader outreach and communications
- **DCHI Board will begin strategic planning process** to discuss goals and financial sustainability

Behavioral Health EMR Incentive Program

- HCC released an RFP on August 22 for the **BH EMR Incentive Program**
- Delaware Behavioral Health Providers can apply for **financial incentives** to:
 - **Purchase** a new EMR system
 - **Upgrade or enhance** an existing system
- Deadline for questions is **September 6**

- Deadline for applications is **October 3**
- Another round of funding is anticipated in 2016

DCHI Board approved “Implementation Plan for Behavioral Health Integration”

Behavioral testing program aims to solve operational challenges of integration

Implementation plan influenced by five design principles

- 1** Test operational feasibility, not outcomes
- 2** Ensure reasonable diversity across practice types, geographies, and patient populations
- 3** Support startup activities for participants
- 4** Establish sustainable support structure that will enable statewide rollout
- 5** Test multiple models of integration with a diverse set of practices across the state

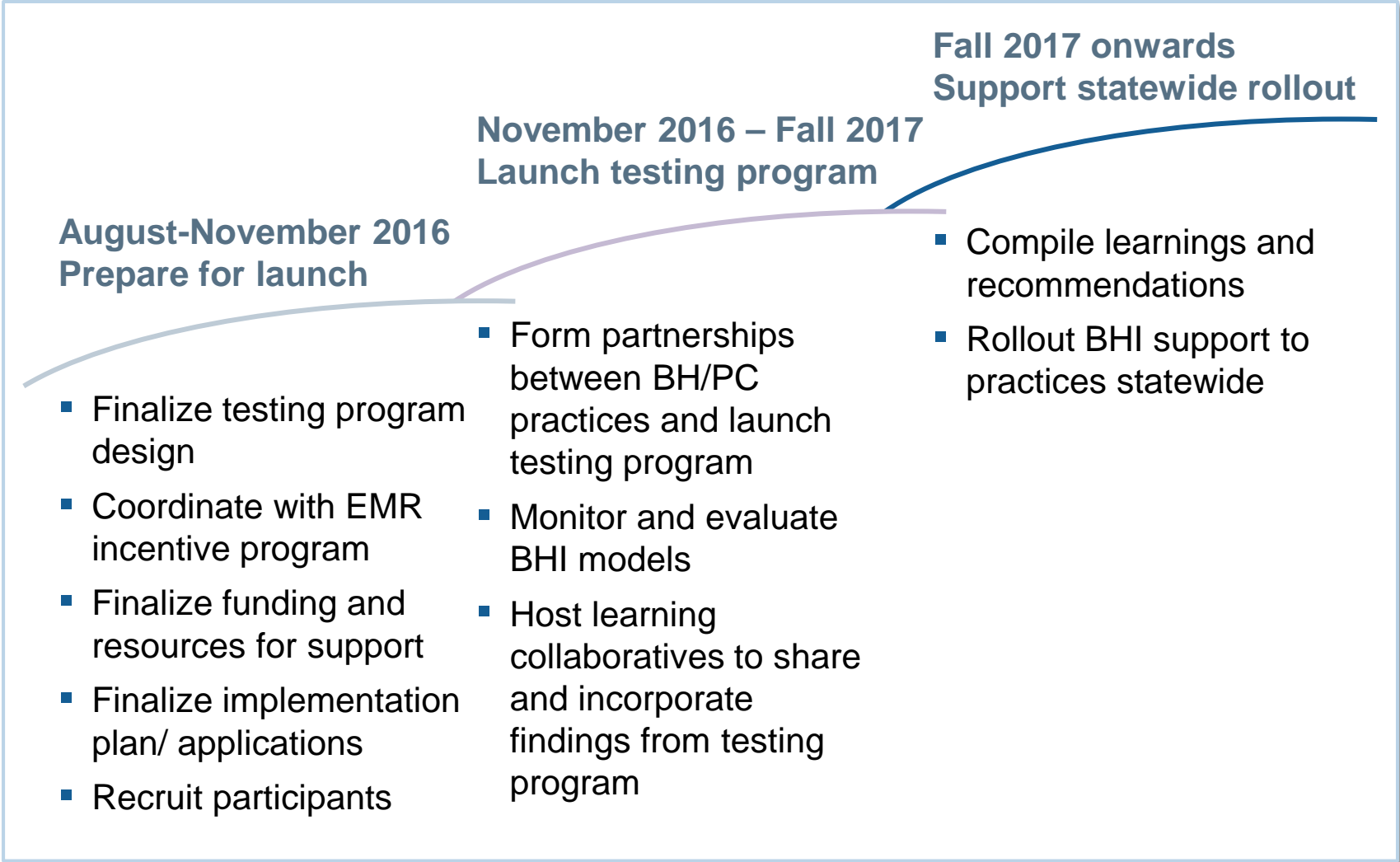

Path forward for behavioral health integration testing program



DCHI Board approved Consensus Paper on “Licensing and Credentialing Health Care Providers”

Recommendations

- 1) Identify the end goal for streamlined credentialing procedures within Delaware
- 2) Operationally define and set parameters related to applications, time limits
- 3) State legislation should be considered as a policy lever to set streamlined credentialing parameters for hospitals, provider networks, and payers
- 4) Delaware should transition to an Automated Credentialing System in the future
- 5) Ensure providers new to Delaware have access to licensing and credentialing resources
- 6) Remove the Delaware Practical Board Examination as a requirement for dental licensure
- 7) Remove the one year waiting period imposed on applicants interested in taking the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology
- 8) State Licensing Boards to inform individuals on the status of their application
