
- Joint venture partnership formed between ChristianaCare and Delaware Neurosurgical Group
- The only single-focus, comprehensive, full-scope ambulatory outpatient spine surgery center within Delaware and the surrounding area
- Estimated capital expenditure is \$5.2M and includes minor renovation
 - 32,000 square feet
 - Six (6) operating rooms
 - Five (5) overnight rooms with 23-hour stay capacity for spine surgical patients
 - Post-surgical recovery space
