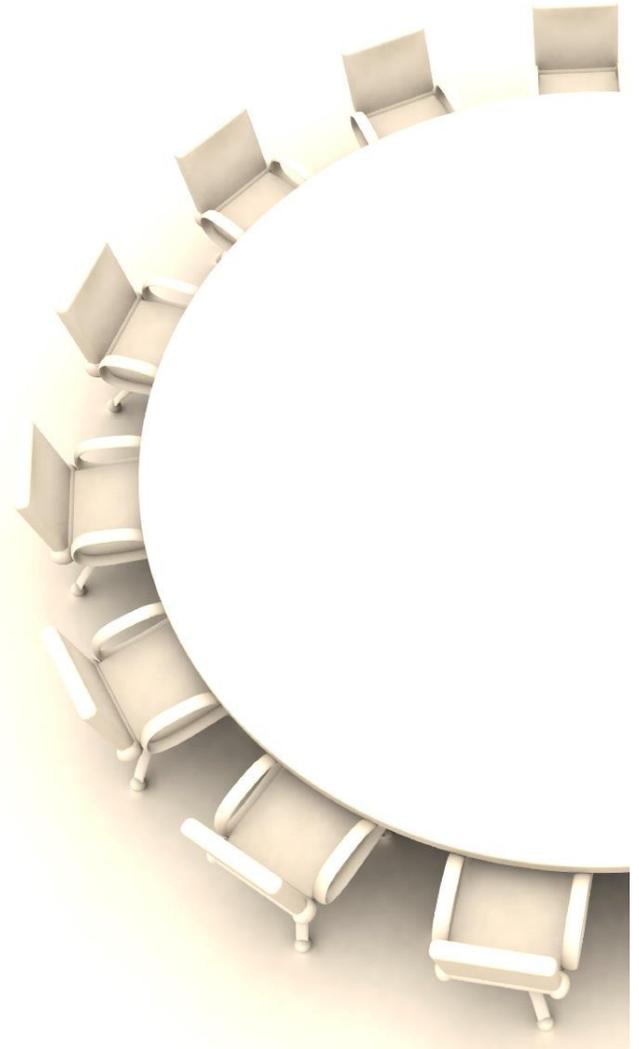

- *NOTE:* Organizations did not need to respond to RFIs to be eligible to submit responses to RFPs

As a reminder, the Common Scorecard will...

- Be a single source for quality, utilization, cost, and patient experience metrics – across payers
- Show data across the whole patient panel
- Link incentive payments to one set of metrics

- **Finalize measure definitions**
Q1-Q2, 2015
- **Testing and feedback**
Q2- Q4, 2015
- **All PCP practices can receive reports**
Q1, 2016
