Current Data Analysis Capabilities

Descriptive analysis*

- Number of licensed providers of a particular type
- Age (and therefore retirement likelihood)
- Gender
- Degree
- Specialization (if applicable)
- Location by zip code
- School attended (for physicians partial complete)
- Undergrad school attended (for physicians partial complete)
- DIMER yes/no
- Rural designation

^{*} Not all of these analysis types are included in this presentation, but will be published online and in the next formal report

Current Data Analysis Capabilities, continued

Comparative Analysis

- Providers to population ratios
- Specialists to chronic disease ratios
- Change in provider numbers by license type
- Degree advancement for instance, resident to fully time practice physician, or stacking of nursing degrees
- Providers and provider type against most publicly available census data

Current Data Analysis Capabilities, continued

Predictive Analysis (forecasting)

- We need a *minimum* of three data points over time with which to work. We just received the third data point and are importing all of that data now.
- We will be prepared to start showing trends (and therefore be predictive) after we have the fourth data point (monolithic data upload) in January 2024.
- We CAN perform simple linear regression analysis, and therefore identify outlier datapoints from a statistical standpoint using the sorting method, data visualization method, z scores, or interquartile range method.


Caveats

- We accept data from the Delpros system as our source of truth and do not double check it for accuracy which would be out of scope for this work.
- Some licensing boards continuously update, while others update on a periodic basis (like the two-year cycle for nursing). This impacts number consistency year after year.
- Active license status tells us nothing about whether the practitioner is seeing patients, and if so, what percent of their time is allocated to seeing patients.
- We are actively working on identifying all "concierge" physicians and creating the ability to include or exclude them from counts and mapping
- We do not have a good handle on which insurance coverages are accepted by which practitioners.
- Delpros does not currently consistently collect actual practice location versus what address is used for a practitioner's license. This creates bias in the resulting maps. We are working to address this.


High Level Update

- Rebound is real
- Interstate Compacts are on the rise and we see the impact in the data
- Aging out / Retirement continues. We need one more data point to establish a trend which will come before the end of this calendar year.
- Maldistribution between counties appears to be balancing out, but we need additional data to substantiate what looks like a positive trend. Accounting for telemedicine remains challenging.
- Shortages as perceived/informed by:
 - Consumers/patients
 - Specialty specific
 - Institutions
 - Others?









Physician Specialty by AAMC Taxonomy








Board of SLP and HA Dispensers Maps









Next Steps/Recommendations

- Developing benchmarking (i.e. recommended minimums) at the specific license level for most major types of healthcare providers licensed through the Division of Professional Regulation
- Additional surveys (we are already collaborating with the Delaware Healthcare Association to create an institutional need survey; with the Medical Society of Delaware and Office of Primary Care for an additional data practitioner tool; and with the Delaware Nurses Association for additional information from the nursing profession)
- Additional questions upon new license and renewal of license process for healthcare providers
- Standing up new requirements for the registration of Community Health Workers, Direct Service Providers, Certified Nursing Assistants, and other groups currently unregistered or licensed in Delaware. (What we can't count we can't assess).
