NOTICE OF INSPECTION TO THE FOOD ESTABLISHMENT PERMIT HOLDER/PERSON-IN-CHARGE

Purpose

This Notice advises you that a representative of the Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH) will conduct a regulatory inspection on the premises of this food establishment.

Information

The operating permit of this food establishment will expire within the next <u>90 days</u>. Following the inspection, you will receive a Food Establishment Inspection Report.

Action Required

You are required to take the necessary action to correct all violations noted on the Food Establishment Inspection Report within the time specified.

- If you fail to correct priority and priority foundation violations within the time specified in the Food Establishment Inspection Report, you will be assessed a feefor-service for each follow-up inspection required.
- If you fail to correct all priority and priority foundation violations 15 days prior to the expiration of the current permit, the operating permit will not be reissued, and you will be required to cease food operations on the premises of this food establishment.

Authority

16 *Del. Code*, § 122(3)u provides DPH the authority to promulgate and enforce standards to regulate food establishments.

16 *Del. Code*, § 134 provides DPH the authority to assess fees for follow-up inspections, and to withhold issuance of a permit to a food establishment that does not receive a satisfactory rating on inspection.

State of Delaware Food Code, Subpart 8-402, provides DPH the right of access to conduct regulatory inspections in permitted food establishments.

State of Delaware Food Code, Subpart 8-602, provides DPH the authority to order closure of a food establishment found operating without a valid permit.
