

Delaware Weekly Influenza Report Week 43 (October 20 – October 26, 2013) Delaware Division of Public Health

National Synopsis 2013 - 2014

National data are updated Friday of each week. Please visit http://www.cdc.gov/flu/weekly/ for the most current information. Briefly, influenza activity remained low in the United States with 1 state (Alabama) and Puerto Rico reporting regional activity; 4 states reporting local flu activity (MS, NV, SC, and TX); Guam and 30 states reporting sporadic flu activity, and 15 states reporting no flu activity.

Both national and state data are provisional and subject to change as additional reports are received.

Delaware Influenza Surveillance 2013 – 2014

There was 1 confirmed case of influenza reported during week 43. Reports of influenza-like illness (ILI) received from participating providers, facilities, and institutions indicated a relatively low level of ILI in the community. Levels of ILI reported by sentinel providers participating in ILINet were 1.5%; below the regional baseline of 2.0%.

Level of Influenza Activity in Delaware, Week 43:

Sporadic

Small numbers of laboratory-confirmed influenza cases or a single laboratory-confirmed influenza outbreak has been reported, but there is no increase in cases of ILI.

Influenza-like illness (ILI) is defined as patients presenting with fever of 100° F or greater, cough and/or sore throat in the absence of a known cause other than influenza.

No Activity: No laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza and no reported increase in the number of cases of ILI.

Sporadic: Small numbers of laboratory-confirmed influenza cases or a single laboratory-confirmed influenza outbreak has been reported, but there is no increase in cases of ILI.

Local: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in a single region of the state.

Regional: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI and recent laboratory confirmed influenza in at least two but less than half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in those regions.

Widespread: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in the state.





U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) (Sentinel) Provider Surveillance Network:

An ILINet (sentinel) provider conducts surveillance of influenza-like illness (ILI) in collaboration with the Division of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Data reported by ILINet providers, in combination with other influenza surveillance data, provide a national and statewide picture of influenza activity in the U.S.


Figure 2. Percentage of visits for influenza-like illness (ILI) reported by sentinel healthcare providers participating in the U.S. Outpatient ILI Surveillance Network (ILINet), Delaware 2013-2014.



¹ Eleven of 20 sentinel providers reported during Week 43.



- Many people ill with influenza-like symptoms do not seek medical care.
- Many who do seek medical care are not tested for influenza.
- The Delaware Public Health Laboratory (DPHL) is limited by capacity to processing a maximum of 3 specimens per day from each reporting entity.
