

Delaware Weekly Influenza Report MMWR Week 2 (January 11 – 17, 2015) Delaware Division of Public Health

National Influenza Synopsis 2014-2015:

National data are updated Friday of each week. Please visit http://www.cdc.gov/flu/weeklv/ for the most current information. During MMWR Week 2 (January 11 - 17, 2015), influenza activity remained elevated in the U.S. The severity of flu disease so far this season is similar to some previous seasons in which influenza A (H3N2) viruses have circulated predominantly. The geographic spread of influenza in 44 states was reported as widespread. Guam, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands and five states (Alabama, Georgia, Hawaii, Minnesota and Tennessee) reported regional activity. The District of Columbia and Alaska reported local activity. Both national and state data are provisional and subject to change as additional reports are received.

Delaware Influenza Surveillance 2014-2015:

During MMWR Week 2, there were 141 laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza reported among Delaware residents, bringing the total number of laboratory-confirmed cases this season to 1,748. Reports of influenza-like illness (ILI) received from participating providers, facilities and institutions indicated a "moderate activity" level in the community. The proportion of outpatient visits for influenza-like illness (ILI) was 4.1% in Delaware, above the regional baseline of 2.0%, and 4.5% nationally.

Level of Influenza Activity in Delaware, MMWR Week 2:

Widespread

Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in the state.

Influenza-like illness (ILI) is defined as patients presenting with fever of 100° F or greater, cough and/or sore throat in the absence of a known cause other than influenza.

No Activity: No laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza and no reported increase in the number of cases of ILI.

Sporadic: Small numbers of laboratory-confirmed influenza cases or a single laboratory-confirmed influenza outbreak has been reported, but there is no increase in cases of ILI.

Local: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in a single region of the state.

Regional: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least two but less than half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in those regions.³

Widespread: Outbreaks of influenza or increases in ILI cases and recent laboratory-confirmed influenza in at least half the regions of the state with recent laboratory evidence of influenza in the state.

³ Region = population under surveillance in a defined geographical subdivision of a state. Regions typically include several counties. Regional doesn't apply to states with ≤ four counties.

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¹ 2014-2015 Region 3 (DE, DC, MD, PA, VA, and WV) baseline = 2.0%.

Laboratory-confirmed case = case confirmed by viral culture or PCR.



The Division of Public Health Laboratory now has the capability to identify lineage for Influenza B. Since some laboratories in the state do not have this capability, these influenza cases will be categorized as Influenza B, no lineage identified.



U.S. Outpatient Influenza-Like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) Sentinel Providers

An ILINet (sentinel) provider conducts surveillance for influenza-like illness (ILI) in collaboration with the Division of Public Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Data reported by ILINet providers, in combination with other influenza surveillance data, provide a national and statewide picture of influenza activity in the U.S.


Figure 2. Percentage of visits for influenza-like illness reported by sentinel providers¹ participating in the U.S. Outpatient ILI Surveillance Network (ILINet), Delaware 2014-15



Summary of International Influenza Activity

Globally influenza activity continued to increase in the northern hemisphere with influenza A(H3N2) viruses predominating so far this season. In North America, the influenza season was ongoing with influenza activity still increasing in most areas. Influenza A(H3N2) was the predominant virus. In the United States, flu activity continued to increase in intensity and expand geographically in many areas of the country. The severity of flu disease so far this season is similar to some previous seasons in which influenza A (H3N2) viruses have circulated predominantly. In Canada, ILI activity was within expected levels. Influenza detections continued to increase and influenza A(H3N2) and influenza A (not subtyped) have predominated. Influenza activity increased in some countries of the Caribbean, decreased in Central America and was low in the tropical countries of South America. In Europe influenza activity was still low, but the season seemed to have started. In eastern Asia, influenza activity increased with influenza A(H3N2) virus predominant. In tropical Asia, influenza activity increased slightly but remained low with influenza B predominating.
