

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES (DHSS) LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

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153rd General Assembly Legislative Update

Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH)

- HB 21 <u>Ban on Tianeptine ("Gas Station Heroin")</u>
 Classifies Tianeptine as a Schedule I controlled substance, banning its sale in Delaware. The drug is being misused and sold as a supplement, despite FDA concerns.
- HB 54 <u>Creates the Office of Suicide Prevention</u>
 Establishes a centralized Office to coordinate statewide suicide prevention strategies, support local efforts, manage funding, and report progress to the legislature.
- HB 87 Expands Suicide Prevention Coalition
 Adds two seats to the Coalition for individuals with lived experience—one suicide attempt survivor and one survivor of suicide loss—to ensure inclusive decision-making.



Department-Wide (DHSS – Multiple Divisions)

- HB 5 Regulation Sunset Process
 Creates an automatic expiration for agency regulations unless reviewed and renewed by a new legislative committee. Aims to increase accountability and reduce outdated rules.
- HB 78 Expands Public Access to Meeting Recordings
 Requires public bodies to post digital recordings of meetings online within 7 business days and keep them up for a year. Applies to school boards and other state entities.
- HB 140 End-of-Life Options Law
 Allows terminally ill adults to request and self-administer life-ending medication with extensive safeguards, oversight, and DHSS reporting. Implementation set for 2026. Honors advocates Ron Silverio and Heather Block.



Division of Health Care Quality (DHCQ)

SB 67 – <u>Updates Background Checks for Home Care</u>
 Sets a 3-year validity period for criminal background checks
 and requires DHSS to use the FBI's Rap Back system to notify
 employers of any new offenses.



Division of Medicaid & Medical Assistance (DMMA)

- HB 56 Requires Coverage for Medically Necessary Skin Removal Ensures Medicaid, state employee plans, and private insurers cover procedures like panniculectomies when excess skin poses health risks after major weight loss or surgery.
- SJR 2 <u>Study Medicaid Coverage for Community Health Workers</u>
 Directs DHSS to explore adding Community Health Worker services to
 Medicaid, including a draft state plan amendment by 2026.



Division of Public Health (DPH)

- HB 46 <u>Parental Consent for Abortion in Minors</u>
 Requires parental or court consent for abortions for minors under 16, with exceptions for medical emergencies or abuse cases. Replaces older notice-based rules.
- HB 70 Lead Safety in Older Rental Units
 Mandates certification that rental units built before 1978 are lead-free or lead-safe, with grants for remediation and strong tenant protections. Phased implementation begins in 2028.
- HJR 1 <u>Small Restaurant Regulatory Reform Task Force</u>
 Establishes a task force to review and reduce burdensome health regulations on small restaurants. Recommendations are due by June 2026.
- SB 41 <u>Bans Red Dye 3 in Food</u>
 Prohibits sale of food with Red Dye 3—a petroleum-based additive linked to cancer and behavioral issues—starting January 2027. Follows federal revocation.
- SB 72 <u>PFAS ("Forever Chemicals") in Drinking Water</u>
 Requires a new public website showing PFAS levels in drinking water. Water companies must notify residents when PFAS levels exceed safety thresholds.



Division of Social Services (DSS))

- HJR 2 Explore Restaurant Meals Program for SNAP
 Directs DHSS to evaluate joining the federal program that allows SNAP
 recipients who are elderly, disabled, or unhoused to buy hot prepared
 meals at restaurants.
- SB 65 Withdraws Delaware from RGGI Removes Delaware from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative. The state already exceeded CO₂ goals, but the program was driving up energy costs. This aims to improve affordability and growth.
- HB 50 <u>LIHEAP+</u>
 Creates the Delaware Energy Fund to help low- and moderate-income households (under 350% of the federal poverty level) afford rising energy costs.
