## ONGOING CMC INITIATIVES

### **Update regarding ENFit supplies from CVS:**

- A prescription will be needed for CVS to dispense ENFit medication syringes and bottle adapters.
- Individual CVS locations will stock the needed syringes and adapters once they have customers with prescriptions at their location.
- The quantity of syringes and adapters dispensed with medications will depend on the patient's insurance plan and store practices. This may vary by location.
- The following sizes are currently available:
  - Syringes: 0.5 mL, 1mL, 3mL, 6mL, 12mL, and 20 mL
  - Bottle Adapters: 17-20 mm, 20-23mm

## Medicaid Benefits for Children with Medical Complexity

### What are the Medicaid benefits and services?

Medicaid offers health insurance and assistance for children who qualify based on factors such as a low-income household or having a long-term disability or illness that requires specialized care.

One important benefit includes Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) services. All Medicaid-enrolled children and adolescents (under age 21) will receive preventive care, screenings, and treatment needed to maintain or improve their health.

Examples include doctor visits, prescriptions, immunizations, labs and x-rays, medical transportation, and mental health services.



### How can Medicaid support my child with medical complexity?

For children with complex health needs, Medicaid provides access to long-term services. Examples include durable medical equipment, incontinence and other medical supplies, and nutritional supplements. Many of these medically necessary services can now be provided at your child's home.

## Transitions of Care

Transitions of Care are moments when a child's care is transferred from one setting or level of care to another. These transitions are particularly vulnerable points in the child and family's journey within the healthcare continuum.

# PDN INITIATIVE



- The Private Duty Nursing initiative progressed through a structured timeline over the year. In the first quarter, we established strong collaborations with key partner agencies and secured a champion to lead the effort. The second quarter focused on developing and finalizing a Nursing Assessment Tool with valuable input from nursing schools and home care agencies, while also evaluating existing curricula and planning data analysis and orientation materials.
- As we near project completion, we are preparing educators for implementation and distribution of the Nursing Student Assessment Tool, developing awareness campaigns, designing evaluations to measure the impact on nursing retention and tenure, and continuing to encourage partnerships between nursing programs and home health agencies.
