#### OVERVIEW OF PROCESS AND PROGRESS TO DATE

- Met with MCOs to discuss the analysis.
- Developed reporting spreadsheet and instructions.
- Provided MCOs with list of children who received PDN in calendar 2018.
- MCOs collaborated with nursing agencies to complete the analysis.
- MCOs completed their PDN gaps in care analysis and sent results to DMMA.
- DMMA has begun analysis of MCO findings.

# POTENTIAL AREAS TO EXPLORE IN DATA ANALYSIS

- Distribution of the number of nursing agencies serving children receiving PDN
- Distribution of the number of hours of PDN authorized per child receiving PDN
- Distribution of hours authorized but not covered
- Top 5 reasons for PDN hours authorized but not covered by month
- Reason codes most frequently seen in combination

- Potential trends or correlations, such as:
  - Gaps related to seasonality and weekends/holidays
  - Geographical differences (by county)
  - Differences in reason codes by number of PDN hours approved
  - Any correlation between number of nursing agencies serving the child and hours not covered
  - Any correlation between number of hours approved and agencies declining authorized hours
